
#### A PARABLE, A PAINTING AND YOU

The parable of the Prodigal Son is the story of a father who has two sons and loses both of them; the younger one is lost in a foreign country, while the elder is lost in the wilderness of his own self- righteous hostility. One leaves home in the hope of finding happiness only to find that it is found in the familiar. One stays at home and is so cut off from the love and support around him that he might as well be in a foreign land. By the end of the story love and forgiveness win out when the younger son returns but it is unclear if the older son puts his hostility aside and forgives his brother and father.

Rembrandt, a seventeenth century Dutch artist, depicted the parable in his painting, The return of the Prodigal Son. We see the father, hands resting on his kneeling son's shoulders, the son's head buried in his father's chest. The elder son looks on in distain. The servants remain in the background.

Let us take a closer look at the picture and identify with the people there. See the younger son, a normal adolescent who wants freedom, money and a good time. He insults his father, wishing him dead by demanding his share of the property, leaves home and travels to a foreign land, squanders his money and loses his friends, his dignity and religious values. Finally he comes to his senses, decides to return home and become a servant in his father's house. Look at the father. How did he treat this son? He gave him his inheritance and let him go. But he never forgot him, loving him all the time and watching for his return. When he does return he runs to meet him, embraces him, provides him

with sandals and robes and throws a "Welcome Home" par-



ty for him.

The elder son, the tall figure on the right, is the one who stayed at home. He is full of resentment towards his father, angry with his brother and dissatisfied with his own lot in life. He removes himself psychologically and emotionally from everyone. He doesn't know he is lost. But the father

loves him as much as he loves his younger son. Both are accepted as they are. Where are you in the picture? Are you the returning son/daughter, or the one who stayed at home or the father/ mother giving unconditional love???

#### Reception of the Sacraments—a Keview!

Over the past few years the Parish Team and the Parish Pastoral Council have put a lot of energy and time into the preparation of the Sacraments of Reconciliation and First Holy Communion. Over the past seven months boys and girls have

met outside school hours to prepare for these two

Sacraments (known as Faith Fun and Friendship). This new approach is mostly parish based, in conjunction with the curriculum taught in school. We have been celebrating different days throughout the liturgical year and introduced different types of prayer services. (Remembrance service, nativity play and reconnected with the Sacrament of Baptism) We, the Parish Team and Parish Pastoral Council, believe that this is the healthy way forward as it gives schools the opportunity to focus on the curriculum and remember not every child in the school is Catholic and not all want to receive the Sacraments. It also means that we as a parish get to know the families. This is also in line with the Diocesan policy which was introduced in 2012 (more information can be found here: https:www.dublindiocese.ie/wp-content/

They have been asked to choose a Sunday Mass during the month of May for their child to receive their First Holy Communion. As followers of Christ we meet every Sunday to celebrate His life, death and resurrection. On the first weekend in May one family will join the 10.30am celebration and 22 families joining the congregation at the 12noon Mass. The following weekend we have 22 Families joining the 10.30am celebration and another eleven Families for the 12noon Mass. On Sunday 19th we have five families joining the 12noon celebra-



tion and three families for the last weekend in May for the 12noon mass.

As this is new to all of us and we are doing this in the hope and belief that the Spirit will guide us through this new approach. Please pray for these children and their families as they prepare. Any questions comments and suggestions-
