Pentecost Sunday is often called the birthday of the Church. For the ancient Israelites, Pentecost (meaning 'fiftieth') was a harvest festival celebrated fifty days after the opening of the harvest and several decades after the death of Jesus, the early Christians reflected on their origins and chose this feast to mark the birth of God's new covenant with God's people.

In today's first reading (Acts 2:1-11), Luke tells the new Pentecost story. We find the disciples of Jesus huddled together in a room. The first followers of Jesus weren't strong, courageous or even

very faithful. They had betrayed Jesus. They denied and deserted him when he needed them the most. After his death they hid themselves away in fear. They had lost all heart and hope. Then the strangest thing happens to them. The house shakes with the sound of a mighty wind and the sight of fire! These frightened and frail men and women are transformed. Through the Holy Spirit, they are given new hope, new heart and new purpose. Their fear and silence is replaced by courage and conviction. They leave their hiding place and make their way into the streets and proclaim the good news of the resurrection. They become new people with a new message. At this very moment the missionary church is born.

In the Gospel the risen Christ appears to the disciples who are huddled behind locked doors and gives the reassurance and certainty of the Advocate who "will teach you everything" and "...be with you forever". The Spirit is very much alive, in our time. We need to be open to that Spirit who is teaching us to be and revealing Jesus' message to us. And the mark of this Advocate? Love. The mark of the followers of Jesus? Love. The Holy Spirit is the unique source of our capacity to deal with those who wish violence. The Holy Spirit is the source of our power to forgive, of our hope and courage, and witness to God's compassion and healing. In our times, the earth itself cries out for forgiveness, for hope and for healing - for Love. On this birthday of our Church are we like the disciples, fearful behind closed doors of our churches or are we facing our world with a new hope, a new heart and a new purpose?

So, on this feast of the Holy Spirit; how does our faith, our Church make our world a better place? How are we carrying on this mission to bring and be love & peace to our community? Happy birthday to the Catholic Church! Happy birthday to you, who are the body of the Church! We're all familiar with our own birthdays, and we celebrate them because they mark the day of the year in which we entered into this life. But did you know you have a second birthday?

Because you are part of the body of the Church, Pentecost is the Church's birthday, and yours as well. And like any birthday, it's a cause for celebration. The word Pentecost is Greek and it means "50th day." Fifty days after Easter Sunday, we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and their followers, and the beginning of their Earthly ministry to make disciples of all nations. Pentecost is also a Jewish holiday, which the Jews use to celebrate the end of Passover. Jews celebrate the gift of the law to Moses at Mt. Sinai on this day. But we, as Catholics celebrate the birth of our Church.



Easter season is officially over with the celebration of the coming of the Holy Spirit. We will enter into Ordinary Time from Monday. All Easter symbols will be removed from tomorrow and please do give a helping hand with removal

and storing. Our gratitude and admiration to the Ministers of the Environment who ensured that the whole Season of Easter was suitably celebrated.




