# LIVING THE RESURRECTION

The Sadducees did not believe in the resurrection. In his answer to their absurd story about one bride for seven brothers, Jesus points out that the resurrected state is a new creation by which we share in the divine life of God. It is different from our present life but a continuation nonetheless of our personalities.

This consoling thought reminds me of a writing that was found on the body of an Israeli soldier who was killed in action in 1948. It goes like this. I am standing on a sea shore. Suddenly a ship at my side spreads her white sails to the morning breeze and starts out for the blue ocean. She is an object of beauty and strength and I stand and watch her until she shows only as a ribbon of white cloud just above where sea and sky mingle with each other. Then someone at my side says, "She is gone". I ask "Gone where?" Gone from my sight - that is all. She is just as large in mast and hull as she was when she left my sight and just as able to bear her load of living freight to the place of destination. Her diminished size is in me, not in her and just at the moment when someone at my side says "She is gone" there are other voices ready on another shore to take up the glad shout "Here she comes". There are indeed other voices on another shore to welcome us home, our own people, and above all the voice of the resurrected Christ saying "Well done, good and faithful one. Come and join us" The resurrection is not just something that happened to Jesus and will happen to us when we die. God is always granting us new life and

filling it with goodness, mercy, love and healing. To believe in our own personal resurrection is a wonderful gift. Believing gives meaning to life. Every day is a resurrection day when we acknowledge that life is a gift and that it is good to be alive. It's always fascinating that humanity has an anticipation of life after death. It beats in the human heart in every culture, in every era of time. You can go back to The Egyptian Book of the Dead and find there prominent belief in life after death in the most ancient of times of human


history. In the tomb of Pharaoh Cheops, sealed over 5,000 years ago was found by archaeologists the solar boat which he

had built to sail through the heavens in the afterlife. The ancient Greek religion, a silver coin was often placed in the mouth of a corpse to pay his fare across the mystic river of death into the land of resurrection life. Even American Indians often placed within the grave of a dead warrior his bow and arrows and sometimes his dead pony so he could have them in the happy hunting ground. Norsemen were buried also with a dead horse and armour to carry on life in the world to come. In Greenland, dead native children were buried with a

dog to guide them through the cold wasteland to come. The Sadducees ask a question that matters to me too:

What is heaven like? In our imagination we shape it to our heart's desire.

The strange questions lead to a good answer about God -God is the God of life, of living beings. No matter who or how many we have loved in life, we look on relationships in eternity as part of the mystery of God and of eternal life. All we know is that God is the God of the living, and we know that God's wish now and always is that we have life and have it to the full. Teresa
