This Sunday's gospel can rock us a bit when we read it first and we can so easily overlook the hope that is in it. As you listen to it or if you read it again ask yourself the question – *What was the community like that Luke was writing this for*? It is obvious they we struggling, under attack, somewhat disjointed and even threatened. *Sound familiar*?

When this was written almost 2,000 years ago the young Church was under crisis, when I was a child it was in crisis, today and into the future... it will be the same. Why? Because we always struggle in the challenge of putting a structure on the fundamental challenge of our faith ... God is Love, who loves us unconditionally. This is a love that is unearned, maybe undeserved in our eyes and even unmerited! But God loves us for who we are. If this is our faith, and if we dare to fully believe it then it sets us a massive challenge – *We have to be that for others, for our community and for our world*. This is not a simple thing because as history has shown us it is easier to judge, it is simpler to dictate how we/other should love and what is acceptable in OUR standards. St Mother Teresa probably puts it best, "If we spent our time judging others then we have no time to love them!"

Our world is struggling and the message of love, belonging and welcome is needed more that ever. We see images on the news of people trapped in the hopelessness of war. We see images of people who have lost loved ones to tragedy. We see images of hate between nations and people. We do not even need the news. We experience all of these horrible things in our own lives. The floods, fires, our families are divided, our jobs are insecure as are our livelihoods; I do not need to go on. You already know that life can be a struggle. The message of today's gospel is threefold – the faithfulness to God, despite appearances; a call to conversion, to constantly rise to the challenge of love; and the call to endurance with the unshaking assurance that God, the Spirit is constantly at working in our world. The point is this: even though the early Christians went through these horrible persecutions for their faith, we still gather in the name of Jesus Christ even today. Those persecuted Christians still told the story of the new life that is found in Jesus.

This is our time, this is our opportunity and it is in this time that we are called to live out our faith. Despite the horrors of life, despite real, preserved or apparent struggles we are encouraged to share the good news with the transforming and unshakable hope it brings - the horrors of the cross were not the last word. Love is the last word. Love is coming to rule the world. *Joy to the world!* We may live in a world of fear, but we are not a people of fear. Do not worry about the horrors of the world or the end of the world rather, trust in the new life found in Jesus, trust in His Spirit at work in our time and hope in the difference each of us make. distinct name to each Full Moon - names we still use today. "November's Full Moon was known as the Geese-going Moon, the Frost Moon and perhaps the most well known, the Full Beaver Moon. Traditionally this is the time of year that beavers are preparing for winter and also the time to set traps before the swamps froze, to ensure supplies of warm winter furs.

And so December 8th 1857 Clondalkin welcomed Mother Joseph Conzaga Coslettt. Mother M. Regis Coslett and mother M Stanislaus Mulcahy, who arrived from Carlow to take

up the challenge of teaching the children of the area. Fr. Moore was true to his word and even gave up his own carpet, chairs and table for the comfort the sisters.

Clondalkin now boasts three primary schools and Secondary school for the education of girls. The original "school" is now used by parishioners for various activities in the parish, courtesy of the sisters. Since their arrival so many moons ago they have been an integral part in our community, always willing to help and be involved in many way to the needs of the parish.

On their Feast Day, Thursday 21st November, we take the opportunity to say "Thanks".

Your service is still much appreciated and needed!
