


Our Family Jesse Tree

The Jesse tree is like the family tree of Jesus. Its name comes from Jesse, who was the father of King David. Jesse and King David were ancestors of Jesus. The Jesse tree shows us more of the important people in the Old Testament. It shows us how long they waited for a king. We know that Jesus is the king that God promised to send. We use the Jesse Tree to remind us of God's promise.

Make a Jesse Tree of your own

There are as many options for Jesse trees as there are families. It costs almost nothing to make. Some use "real" trees, some families use their regular Christmas tree for their Jesse tree ornaments. Some families who place only the Jesse tree ornaments on their Christmas tree. The nice thing about a regular tree is that you have lots of places to hang ornaments with string or hooks, and it's a normal-looking decoration. A little potted evergreen would make a wonderful Jesse tree, too.

Some people place a couple of bare branches in a vase full of marbles and hang their ornaments on those.

Some make Jesse trees completely out of paper, cardboard, or poster board and we've even seen a few made out of felt or fabric. The idea is the same for all of these flat trees: you hang the whole thing on a wall and attach the ornaments with

pins, velcro, or tape.

Make an ornament for your Jesse Tree each day up to Christmas

This can be a great way to prepare as a family for Christmas and maybe get to know the whole story more. Advent can be as long as 28 days when Christmas falls on a Sunday. This year, 2017, it's only 22 days. On years like that just leave a couple out. You can choose which ones you keep and which ones you leave out. Maybe leave out the ones least meaningful to you personally. Although You probably shouldn't leave out Creation or Jesus!

For each of the days there is the **Central Character**, the Theme for the day, the Ornament, the Scripture reading and **a short prayer**

- 1. **Central character: God** Theme: Creation of the Earth & humans Ornament: Earth Reading: Genesis 1: 26-31 *Prayer: Thank you, Lord, for making our wonderful Earth.*
- 2. **Central characters: Adam & Eve** Theme: Sin and sadness Ornament: Apple with snake Reading: Genesis 3: 1-19 *Prayer: Dear Lord, please help us to do the right thing*
- 3. **Central character: Noah** Theme: Promise Ornament: The ark and rainbow.

 Reading: Genesis 6:11-14, 7:17-8:3, 9:8-13 **Prayer: Thank you, God, for keeping all your promises to us**
- 4. **Central character: Abraham** Theme: Faithfulness Ornament: Tent and camel. Reading: Genesis 12:1-7 *Prayer: Help us to obey You, even when we can't see Your great plan*.
- 5. **Central character: Sarah** Theme: Answered prayers Ornament: Baby cradle. Reading: Genesis 21:1-7 *Prayer: Thank you, God, for answering our prayers.*
- 6. **Central character: Isaac** Theme: Protection Ornament: Ram. Reading: Genesis 22:1-14 *Prayer: We praise You, dear God, for looking out for us every day, in every situation*.
- 7. **Central character: Jacob** Theme: God is always with us. Ornament: Ladder. Reading: Genesis 28:10-22 **Prayer: Remind us each day, God, that You are with us, even when we feel alone**
- 8. Theme: A Light to guide us Ornament: Candle. Reading: Isaiah 9:1

 Prayer: Thank You, Lord, for sending Jesus to us to light up the world.
- 9. **Central character: Joseph** Theme: Forgiveness Ornament: Coat of many colours. Reading: Genesis 37:1-36 **Prayer: Dear Lord, please help us to be kind and forgive generously.**
- 10. **Central character: Moses** Theme: Rules Ornament: Ten Commandments. Reading: Deuteronomy 5: 1-22 *Prayer: Loving God, thank You for giving us rules to guide us and keep us safe*.
- 11. **Central character: Rahab** Theme: Courage Ornament: Rope. Reading: Joshua 2:1-21 *Prayer: Dear God, please give us courage to help others, especially when it is not easy.*
- 12. **Central character: Ruth** Theme: God takes care of us. Ornament: Wheat. Reading: Ruth 1:15-2:13 **Prayer: Dear God, thank You for taking care of us. Look after my family in the months and years to come**.
- 13. **Central character: Jesse** Theme: Patience Ornament: Tree stump with new shoot. Reading: Isaiah 11:1-2 *Prayer: Lord, please help us to be patient while we wait for Christmas day.*
- 14. **Central character: Samuel** Theme: God has a plan for us. Ornament: Horn with oil. Reading: I Sam 16:1-13 **Prayer: We thank You, God, that You have a great plan for each of us. Help us to trust in You**
- 15. Theme: Hope Ornament: Watchtower. Reading: Habakkuk 2:1-4

 Prayer: Lord, please be with us while we wait for Christmas day.
- 16. **Central character: Esther** Theme: God has a special job for each of us. Ornament: Sceptre or tiara. Reading: Esther 4 *Prayer: All-knowing God, open our eyes to the special plans you have for us.*
- 17. **Central character: David** Theme: Kings and Shepherds Ornament: Crown. Reading: II Samuel 5:1-5 *Prayer: Thank You, God, for giving us the Good Shepherd, Your Son, to watch over and care for us.*
- 18. **Central character: Elijah** Theme: Praising God Ornament: Altar with fire. Reading: I Kings 18:17-39 **Prayer: We praise You, powerful God, for all You have done for us**
- 19. **Central character: Daniel** Theme: Trust in God Ornament: Lion. Reading: Daniel 6

 **Prayer: God, it is not always easy these days to put you first. Help us to trust & honour You each day.
- 20. **Central character: Ezekiel** Theme: God's Word is food for our souls. Ornament: Scroll. Reading: Ezek 3:1-11 **Prayer: Lord, thank You for Your Holy Word. Give us Your understanding and help us to stay close to You**

- 21. Central character: Isaiah Theme: Truth Ornament: Rose. Reading: Isaiah 6:1-8 Prayer: Thank You, Lord, for Your truth, and those who have been entrusted with it.
- 22. Theme: Peace Ornament: Wolf and lamb lying down together. Reading: Isaiah 11:6-9 Prayer: Loving God, help us find ways to bring peace to our world.
- Central characters: Zechariah & Elizabeth Theme: Faith Ornament: Zechariah & Elizabeth. Reading: Luke 23.
- 1:5-2 Prayer: Almighty God, thank You for the gift of our faith. Help us to share it with others.
- Central character: John the Baptist Theme: Prepare Ornament: Seashell. Reading: Matthew 3:1-6 24. Prayer: Holy God, forgive us when we do things that displease You. Make our hearts ready for Jesus.
- Central character: Joseph Theme: Goodness & kindness Ornament: Hammer & saw. Reading: Matthew 25.
- 1:18- Prayer: God, help us to hear Your voice act and be courageous when You call us.
- 26. Central character: Mary Theme: Purity Ornament: Lilies in heart. Reading: Luke 1:26-38 Prayer: Thank You, Lord, that nothing is impossible with Your help.
- Central character: The Journey to Bethlehem Theme: Guidance Ornament: Town. Reading: Luke 2:1-5 27. Prayer: Guide our journeys, wherever they take us, Holy God.




