Last Thursday we celebrated Presentation Day. In this parish we are very privileged to have four presentation sisters schools. Thanks to Nano Nagle many children got the opportunity to avail of education. Thank you to all the Presentation sisters, in particular the ones in our parish who have given their whole life to the education of our children. As one of the famous Nano Nagle songs says: Who will light the lantern and keep it burning bright?! Could it be you?



Certainly Mary, the mother of God let her light shine when she said "yes" to the Angel Gabriel. I doubt that Mary knew what she got into. Today we celebrate Christ the King, which also marks the end of the liturgical year – the Church calendar.

In the Gospel we hear about the crucifixion, three men hanging on crosses. Jesus, the King, nailed to the cross with two robbers either side – treated like a criminal. So what kind of King is Jesus? Even on the cross Jesus suffering does not end. In the last hours of his life he is being spat at, abused, hit, and hurt. But still in the midst of his suffering he is evangelising others – He is a witness to God's love in his suffering. He is not just Jesus for the happy days, he is also Jesus in the depth of suffer. Even on the cross, dying, He is experiencing mocking and honouring – one thief that does not believe and one who does. This happened on the cross – between heaven and earth. All that was left was a handful of people around the foot of the Cross - spectators, soldiers, some of his friends and his mother Mary. In pain, agony, despair Mary stood at the foot of the Cross. Little did she know that her YES would led her here?! What kind of king has to go through this humiliation in public? Even in the midst of the darkest hours in his life He trusts – He pays the ultimate price for what He believes is right – He dies. Jesus was a different kind of king. Not from this world. Jesus, true man and true God, shows us to trust in the Lord in good times and challenging times.

However, if 8 December is the Second Sunday of Advent, the Solemnity is *transferred* to Monday 9 December, but is then **no longer** a Holyday of Obligation. This is what happens this year.

Walk of Light 2019 Inter-Church Journey The Ecumenical Walk of Light takes place on Sunday 24 Nov from 4-6.30pm. Starting with a welcome and opening Prayer at 4.00pm at St Finian's Church, Adelaide Road, followed by an address by Jane Mellett, Trocaire, at 4.45pm at the Church of Mary Immaculate Refuge of Sinners, Rathmines. Concluding Prayer will be at 5.45pm in Holy Trinity Church, Rathmines.



The solemnity is a newer feast in the Catholic Church; it was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925. The pontiff was witness to a turbulent time in the world's history. Secularism was on the rise and dangerous dictatorships were emerging in Europe and beyond. Christ had long been referred to as King, but Pope Pius and the Christian faithful saw the respect and reverence for Christ's

authority waning in the midst of the unrest during the first part of the 20th century. In response, the feast was set with the intent to reaffirm and refocus faith and respect in the kingship of Jesus.
