This weekend we celebrate in the third Sunday of Advent by lighting the candle of Joy. Today we light the pink candle as we are half way through advent we are reminded to be joyful as Christians. Today is also known as Gaudete Sunday (rejoice). Or as St Paul invites us today: Rejoice in the Lord, always, again I say rejoice.

In the midst of the season of advent we are

preparing our heart and soul for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. Last week, a priest reminded his parishioners that Advent should not become a "lost" season. With many are getting ready for Christmas Day, the food, the tree, the presents, the stress of it all... We are so focused on the end goal – Christmas Day – we forget to take the four weeks of Advent as a present. A time to reconnect with yourselves. Advent is about waiting. In times were we are used to have everything in mouse click waiting can become a challenge. Minnie attended the club and contributed so much by her lovely presence. She always had a lovely friendly smile and hello and always greeted everyone with that lovely smile. She was a very gentle and kind person, and always very encouraging. She was always very grateful for everything. She enjoyed our musical mornings, quizzes, bingo and whatever was going on. She loved to do her Minnie's musical mornings when she would bring along her cassette player and CDs of her very much selected pieces she would play for us. She had her little note book of the list of music to be played with information about the song, singer or musician, or what show the piece was from. None of your sticking on a CD and playing whatever came on. By the end of the morning you knew who Joseph Locke, John McCormack, or Frank Patterson was and what they sang where and when. It was an educational morning and taught us how to appreciate a wide selection of different genres of good music. Minnie would sometimes ring me and say I enjoyed the morning and give encouragement and let me know I was doing well. Thank You Minnie for that as sometimes I worried about if people were enjoying themselves. Minnie was a private person and kept secret her 90th Birthday back in May. However, her secret go out and we celebrated her birthday in a small way the following week. "Ah' it's too much", she said, "I don't need anything, and gone to the trouble," but it was only a small cake and a few flowers. She was so delighted and appreciative of the surprise. We finished off the morning singing "Happy Birthday" and playing her often requested tune "Shoe the Donkey" renamed "Minnie's Donkey.

The sights and sounds and smells of the season are all around us. Is there a particular sound that reminds you of Advent or Christmas – perhaps a carol you've always loved, or the sound of jingle bells? For many, the smell of mince pies or mulled wine are real signs of Christmas. Our towns and cities

are filled with wonderful sights too: festive lights and decorations, trees decked out with tinsel and baubles, while our churches display Nativity scenes. Another common sight in the run-up to Christmas are the charity collectors we meet on the streets, singing carols or shaking buckets, urging us to give generously to a good cause. It is a feast for the senses, with these experiences often evoking warm Christmas memories and putting us in good humour.

Today is known as Gaudete Sunday – Gaudete means 'rejoice'. In our churches, the rose-coloured candle is lit on the Advent wreath to symbolise joy. Today's readings bring out this sense of joyful anticipation of the Lord's coming. The people of Jesus' time would have been familiar with Isaiah's talk of 'everlasting joy and gladness'. And Jesus tells us: 'Happy is the man who does not lose faith in me'. It is this personal encounter with Jesus that we celebrate at Christmas, God becoming man, the Good News announced by John the Baptist in today's Gospel.
