ADVENT, SEASON OF HOPE



The good thing about the Christian Year is that it keeps coming around. Yes, it is Advent again and the beginning of a new Church year, Year A, the year of Matthew.

Advent is a time of expectation and waiting. The people in the Old Testament lived in hope. As God moved through their lives they were

filled with the hope of One who was to come. They were people who waited for promises to be kept and prophesies to be fulfilled until at last the day dawned when a bright and glorious Word pierced their darkness. The Word became flesh and dwelt among them. John the Baptist announced the good news that Someone was coming whose sandals he was not worthy to carry. "Prepare the way of the Lord" was his plea." Give some evidence that you mean to reform". John's expression "turn away from your sins" required them to return from travelling down a wrong road and set out anew on the right road. The people were called to admit their sinful ways and correct them. As a sign that they were sincere John told them to produce the appropriate fruit. "The axe is laid to the tree", he warned. "Any tree that fails to produce good fruit will be cut down".

Advent is a time to remember just how much our world needs Christ. We cannot escape the reality of human suffering when we witness countries divided, civil war annihilating whole communities, refugees fleeing from violence, hungry children ignored, human beings trafficked, greed and wealth destroying the planet. Hope was never so badly needed. We mourn in lonely exile and put our whole hearts into praying "Oh come, oh come Emmanuel".

Advent invites us to slow down and experience the peaceful presence of God in the midst of the chaos. As we light the second of the four Advent candles, Hope, Peace, Joy and Love let us trust in His promise, "I am with you always". We cannot teach someone to hope but we can give hope by living out our own hope. During this Advent Season of Hope let us gospel up our lives with His presence and hang lights in our hearts as well as on our trees.

This is a truly magical and moving event involving the whole community. Live actors, animals, baby, snow etc. On approach to the <code>Beithilin</code> <code>Beo</code>, <code>Live</code> <code>Crib</code> one enters a street scene from BethlehemCenturions, Scribes, People, Animals, Lepers, etc all going about their daily business as if it was only yesterday.....

Then you enter into the world of the <code>Beithilin</code> <code>Beo</code>.....where you sit in bales of hay and watch the story of the whole nativity unfold before you very eyes. Everybody took a great interest in the quilled eagle she brought along together with a picture of tigers and a cups and saucers representing waterfalls. Quilling is an art form using shredded paper, PVA glue and rolling the strips of paper using a tool with a split needle to roll the paper and shape it, and glue together to a achieve a required object. The eagle and the other pieces are only a small sample of the work Eleana does. Eleana teaches art and crafts in different places and she teaches in the Intercultural Centre here in Clondalkin. I never knew of quilling and through Eleana has opened my eyes to this wonderful art. Thank You Eleana for a lovely interesting morning and also telling us of the history of the craft. Eleana will be at the Lucan Library Craft Fair on Sunday 8 December if anyone is interested in seeing more of her work or interested in buying something.

Thank You Sean for the lovely apple strudel you brought for us on Monday. It was delicious and it got a quick death indeed.
