







PRESENTATION OF JESUS IN THE TEMPLE

They met in the Temple, Joseph, Mary and the infant Jesus, Simeon and Anna. They were all there for a purpose. Joseph and Mary brought their infant in obedience to the Law to present Him to God and to offer sacrifice for the purification of the mother who gave birth forty days previously. The Law prescribed that they offer a lamb. The poor were allowed to offer a pair of turtle doves or two pigeons. Mary and Joseph's family were recognised as living below the





Anna was also present in the Temple that day. Led by the Spirit of Prophecy she spoke about the child to all who were present. She belonged to the smallest of the tribes, that of Asher, reminding us that the small and fragile are those most disposed to recognise Jesus, the Saviour.



Tomorrow, feast of St. Blaise, Saint Blaise was the bishop of Sebastea and a doctor. The first known record of the saint's Amidenus, where he is recorded as helping life comes from the medical writings of Aëtius with patients suffering from objects stuck in their throat. Many of the miraculous aspects of St. Blaise's life are written 400 years after his martyrdom in the "Acts of St. Blaise."

Saint Blaise is believed to begin as a healer then, eventually, became a "physician of souls." He then retired to a cave, where he remained in prayer. People often turned to Saint Blaise for healing miracles.

In 316, the governor of Cappadocia and of Lesser Armenia, Agricola, arrested then-bishop Blaise for being a Christian. On their way to the jail, a woman set her only son, who was chocking to death on a fish bone, at his feet.

Blaise cured the child, and though Agricola was amazed, he could not get Blaise to renounce his faith. Therefore, Agricola beat Blaise with a stick and tore at his flesh with iron combs before beheading him.


Today, the Feast of the Presentation of our Lord, known as Candlemas Day. Candles will be blessed at all Masses. Please collect your candles as soon as possible.
