
Daily Reflections for Lent



Today we are celebrating the 5th Sunday in Ordinary time and the Gospel reminds us not to hide away. Let us be the light for ourselves and for others in our lives. Even so it is just over 40 days after Christmas the parish team is already beginning to plan the season of Lent. On Ash Wednesday, 26th of Feb, less than three weeks from now, we are starting the season of lent.

WHAT IS LENT?

Lent is the period of forty days in which the Church prepares for Holy Week and Easter. It has been observed as a time of penance and renewal for the whole Church, with fasting and abstinence, since the



year to the mystery of Jesus in the desert" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 540). The Church sets before us the example of Christ in the desert, so that with him we can prepare for the celebration of Passiontide and Easter by purifying our hearts, taking our Christian life more seriously, and practicing penance. For a long time Christian's focused on penance and the part of renewal was nearly forgotten about. Lent is not a time to only remember to reconcile with each other (and especially God through the Sacrament of Reconciliation) however it is also a time to renew your relationship with God. To support you on that journey the parish team is inviting you to take on a new challenge for lent. Throughout the 40 days we ask you to join a book club. Every Wednesday after the morning mass and evening mass we gather to reflect, to share, to support and to pray for and with each other. You can go to either. 

The Shrine to St Valentine, opposite, and containing the relics of the Saint, is housed in Carmelite Church, Whitefriar St. Ever wondered who was St. Valentine and how he ended up in Dublin? St. Valentine was a clergyman – either a priest or a bishop – in the Roman Empire. At the time, Emperor

Claudius II had banned marriages as he thought single men made better soldiers. However, St Valentine took it upon himself to arrange and perform marriages in secret so couples could still celebrate their love. Unfortunately, the Emperor found out and imprisoned Valentine, sentencing him to death for his crime. He was martyred and his body buried at a Christian cemetery on the Via Flaminia close to the Ponte Milvio to the north of Rome, on February 14, which has been observed as the Feast of St Valentine since 496 AD. In 1835 an Irish Carmelite by the name of John Spratt was visiting Rome. Apparently his fame as a preacher had gone before him, no doubt brought by some Jesuits who had been in Dublin. The elite of

Rome flocked to hear him and he received many tokens of esteem from the dovens of the Church. One such token came from Pope Gregory XVI (1831-1846) and were the remains of Saint Valentine. He is patron of love, young people and happy marriage.



The 12 noon Mass next Sunday, 16th February

will be a special celebration for couples and the Sacrament of Marriage.

There will be a blessing of rings - so if you or someone you know have recently gotten engaged or are celebrating a special anniversary this year leave your name in the parish office!




