

You will have heard me preach or write before that it may be easy to be a follower of Jesus when life is going well and all our plans and dreams are fulfilled. Even in our minor struggles and challenges of life there can be an expectation that God will work something out. Older readers may remember the moment the heard that President Kennedy had been shot or the younger readers when Princess Diana had died. Few people remember the outbreak of the Second



World War in September 1939 but may recall their parents or grandparents talking about it. It has been suggested that this time of the Corona Virus Pandemic will be a period of history that will be written about and probably have films made about it. As Frank Brown PPW mentioned in one of his podcasts *we are living history*.

I had just completed Confirming the boys and girls in Our Lady Queen of the Apostles School in Clonburris when John Murphy, the school principal announced that the school would not be reopening the next day and so began an extraordinary change to the way we live our lives.

The guidelines changed the way we worship and sadly it meant that we had to close our three Churches in order to protect vulnerable parishioners. Through the webcam and Facebook we have connected with people throughout the world offering prayers, Mass, Adoration, Holy Hour, retreats and we even had a baptism during Mass last month. We rearranged some of our weddings for later on in the year. The saddest part of our limited service at this time was the lack of opportunity for families, friends and neighbours to comfort and pray with those who were bereaved. We did offer Masses for the repose of their souls at the time and we plan to have memorial Masses later on in the year. In the midst of all the challenges we saw some extraordinary kindness and reaching out. Neighbours collecting and delivering food, newspapers, medicines and other essential

Pope Francis Easter Sunday

Pope Francis will celebrate Easter Sunday Mass at 11am at the Altar of the Chair in St. Peter's Basilica. The Gospel will be proclaimed in Greek and Latin. At the end of Mass, Pope Francis will go to the Sacristy to remove his vestments, before returning to the Altar of the Confession. From there, he will deliver his **Urbi et orbi** message and give his Easter blessing. The entire celebration will take place inside the Basilica.
