With the possible exception of Martha, as in "Mary has chosen the better part," I suspect there is no scriptural character more misunderstood than the Apostle Thomas. Over the course of history, he has gotten the dubious title of "Doubting Thomas" because Thomas lived by the adage "seeing is believing" and because he looked for certain tangible signs to shore up his belief. But have you ever considered the fact that Thomas never really doubts the Risen Lord? What Thomas doubted was the word and the witness of the disciples, the community of faith. Thomas simply did not find his friends a credible community. But why?



All week we have been journeying together through our social media and web cam, on the road to Pentecost. And this week with gospel stories like Mary at the tomb, The Emmaus story, etc there have been a few common themes. When the person meets the Risen Lord and recognises Him, they immediately rush, filled with joy, to tell others, to spread the good news and to be this for others.

Today in the gospel we hear that Jesus had a appeared to the disciples in the room, but Thomas isn't present. He'd probably just stepped out briefly. Maybe he was doing a food run. Perhaps none of the others would put a toe out the door – but not so, Thomas. He is either fearless or just plain foolhardy – or maybe both! Thomas returns and they tell him they have seen the Lord - but for Thomas, something doesn't ring true. If they have seen the Lord, why are they still locked up tight in that room? If they are filled with such joy, why couldn't he read it on their faces? If they have been empowered by the Spirit of God ... what are they waiting for? So, Thomas says to them, in so many words, "I don't find you believable." Thomas – simple, loyal, loving, straightforward, down to earth, direct — who didn't understand but wanted to, who longed to follow Jesus but who needed to know the way - Thomas didn't doubt the Lord; he doubted the word of his friends! Thomas found it highly unlikely that the Lord was Risen because he was surrounded by a group of witnesses whom he simply did not find credible, whose actions didn't back up what they were saying. There is a huge challenge for us as a church, as a community of faith, especially at this time

There are a number of inspirational, ordinary people in our community doing extraordinary things during this emergency and for them we are unbelievably grateful for being that credible witness to the Risen Lord at work, alive and with us. 
