A WALK FROM DARKNESS INTO LIGHT

In 2009, in the Phoenix Park in Dublin, four hundred people set off on the first Darkness into Light walk to raise funds to support those bereaved by suicide. They believed that through walking and talking together, despair and disappointment can be replaced by hope and acceptance.

Today's gospel describes a walk from Jerusalem to Emmaus by two despairing disciples of Jesus. They are both downhearted and "looking sad". Their faith in Jesus has been extinguished after his execution. They had given up everything to follow him. They witnessed his miracles, listened to his teachings and heard the women's news that he was alive and that the tomb was empty. It was no help to them. They had "hoped" for much more. When a stranger joins them, they tell him of their disappointment. The death of Jesus was no more than a tragic end to a life of promise. They saw themselves as ex- disciples of a dead prophet.

When they had finished their story, the stranger begins his. He invites them to look at the past through the lens of Scripture. He sees the death of Jesus as the reason for his coming into the world. It was the fulfilment of his mission. It was his hour of glory.

As he helps the two disciples to make sense of the past, they invite him to join them for a meal. He gives away his identity by the way he breaks the bread. He is the risen Jesus. He leaves them with hearts that burn, eyes that see and a hope they can share with their companions in Jerusalem. They return from the darkness of Good Friday to the bright light of Easter Sunday.







