

Together we are Church!

This weekend we are celebrating Vocation Sunday, also known as **Good Shepherd Sunday.** Over the past number of years the numbers of vocations entering the seminaries has dropped for various reasons. On this World Day of Prayer for Vocations, we hear in the Gospel that Jesus wants us to have life and to live it to the full. To be able to live life to the full we need to hear His voice which can be crowded out by louder voices, such as



those of worry, fear or anxiety. In the midst of this Corona pandemic the experience has made people anxious and fearful. It also can make people selfish and uncaring. In our community and all around us we see inspirational examples of people living out their vocation - doing ordinary things in the most extraordinary and inspirational of ways. They stand as a shining example of our true vocation - Love. A love that encompasses compassion, care, forgiveness and support. A love that does not stand idlily by - that focus' on 'We' not 'Me'. If we truly follow Jesus' example, if we emulate His mission and if we take time to recognize that He walks this journey intimately and unconditionally, He will always lead us in the ways of love, and in this way we will lead full lives. Vocation Sunday is more than the call to priesthood or religious life. Einstein once said,

"In a the midst of unknown and uncertainty show me a person who is hope-filled and content and I will show you a religious person'. In this pandemic emergency we see the need for those who can live, show and proclaim the Easter message - "That death does not have the final say". We need to recognize, see and be people whose faith and vocation keeps hope alive. It is a call to everyone of us.

What is your Vocation and, in the midst of what is happening at present, how are you living it out?

If you are married or single, if you are a religious or a priest, young or old, parent or single, if you are actively involved in the Church or not, ... - together we are called to be love and share love with others because together we are Church. We are connected by faith, by hope, by prayer and by purpose. Our diversity is our joy, our difference is our creativity and our message is needed! So, in the midst of this crisis, let us be Church in whatever way we can, with love at its centre.

This week ask yourself - How is my faith, my calling making a difference to how I am responding to this emergency and how I am supporting others through this most difficult of times? How am I, and how are we being Church?



A Word from Fr Damian

I'm writing this on Friday 1st May when we should have been finishing up the Confirmation Mass for the boys from Saint Joseph's Boys National School. We have celebrated Confirmation on the feast day of the school for the past number of years. We send our best wishes to Niall Desmond, School Principal, his staff and pupils and to assure the boys that Confirmation will take place sometime during 2020. This Sunday is also the start of our First Holy Communion Masses and we shall endeavour to see how we can celebrate this special occasion later on in the year. Many of the rights of passage associated with schools, Confirmation, graduations and the junior certificate examination now look like they may not take place in the way we have envisaged and from my stage in life it may seem unimportant to our younger parishioners it can be a cause of anxiety and uncertainty. Below is a lovely piece on the tradition of the May Altars. When we think about the life of Mary and Joseph and how they face their uncertain future with trust and faith maybe we could commend these difficult times to their protection. We had four funerals during the week and we extend our sympathies to their families in their time of loss.

For the Month of May - Pope Francis has asked that, during the Month of May, the Rosary should be recited in the Church right across the World in the context of the coronavirus and its effects. Pope Francis also composed two special prayers for the occasion which we have shared on our website and Facebook pages. Traditionally during this month many people create a small altar in their home and many schools made them in their classrooms during the month of May. The altar is traditionally dedicated to Mary, the mother of God. May is also the first month of summer, so it comes to pass that altars





which are created during this time are adorned with flowers that bloom at this time of year and with particular prayers, or items of devotion such as rosary beads to decorate this special space and to express our love and honour to Mary. We are also asking you to create a 'May Altar', a 'Marian Prayer space' in your home for this month and send us in a picture of yours to our email, or Facebook page and we'll share them!! Thanks to those who have already sent them in.



Change the word 'Yours' to 'Mine'


