

BACK TO SCHOOL

There are markers and events throughout the year that remind me of what month it is and a rhythm and routine that anchor the seasons. The month of August I associate with returning to my old parish in Texas, All Ireland hurling and football semi finals,

pilgrimage to Knock on the 15th August, Leaving Certificate results and, as a deathknell to the Summer holidays, the Rose of Tralee festival. The first week of September usually brings good weather and the newspapers are full of first day of school photos and there is a sense of a new beginning. This year all of my August landmarks were covered up or disappeared and Tuesday is the first of September with schools reopening in a manner none of us anticipated six months ago.

Most of our principals and deputy principals had very little time off during the summer as they prepared their schools for reopening. We are aware of the challenges facing schools as we had a similar experience when we reopened our churches for public Mass after months of lockdown. The major difference with schools is that the pupils are younger than an average church congregation and the pupils and staff are in school much longer than we are at Mass. As chairperson of three school boards, I have seen the excellent work that teachers have already done to make sure that the classroom

experience is as close to normal as possible. During these first few weeks the greatest gift that all connected with schools will need is that of patience.

During August we had three of our delayed First Communion Masses in the Village and Knockmitten and this will continue until the middle of October. Next Saturday we have the first wedding from the parish in six months. Please God this is a sign that we are returning to some form of normality.

Lord, bless all connected with our schools and keep them safe.

We pray for all those in our country and throughout the world suffering from the Corona Virus. May its victims and their families be strengthened by the support of our community of faith and restored soon to full health. We also pray for our leaders and medical personnel who deal with the virus. May we keep calm and may we join together in solidarity with care and compassion to tackle this emergency. This we ask in confidence through Christ Our Lord. Amen


