WHY DID YOU DOUBT?

The Gospel extract read at Mass today is one very familiar to us. Peter tries to imitate Jesus by walking on water but fails and begins to sink. Jesus admonished him with two forceful reprimands 'man of little faith' and 'why did you doubt'. I've preached many times on the challenges to our faith which can be dented, battered and bruised when our dreams, hopes and plans do not materialise or when bad or sad events occur in our lives.

On bank holiday Monday two of our parishioners Pauline and Robbie celebrated their golden

wedding anniversary. During the Mass our happy couple renewed their marriage vows they made in the Village Church exactly fifty years ago. It was a lovely day for themselves, their children and grandchildren one of whom read an extract from Saint Paul's second letter to the Corinthians which is familiar to us. I mentioned that in their lives Paula and Robbie tried to be patient and kind, not to be envious nor boastful, to be patient and generous etc. This maybe easy to live out when everything is going well but maybe not so when a couple are not as healthy, not as wealthy, and when unexpected challenges occur in a marriage.

On Wednesday I visited the house of a friend to watch the funeral of John Hume who also made the Corinthians reading real. He must have had many doubts about his work in creating a just society and in the tentative stage of the peace process but he persevered to the end even at a great cost to himself personally and politically. Saint Paul wrote that faith, hope and love will endure and the greatest of these is love. May John Hume whose love for people reached above those who voted for him rest in peace.




