

# FORGIVENESS

In today's Gospel the focus is on forgiveness. Peter asks Jesus how many times we should forgive a person who has offended us. He suggested the perfect number seven but Jesus increased seven to seventy times seven. In other words, granting forgiveness is limitless....it must never end.

Forgiveness is an act of the will. It is not a

feeling. If we pray for a person, we can be assured that we have forgiven that person.

To help accept an individual and open ourselves to him or her, picture that person with the Lord and say, "I forgive because you Lord forgive him/her. Bless him/her and heal me."

Forgiveness is healing. Christian love is always to say, "I forgive." In the prayer that Jesus taught us we pray for forgiveness for ourselves as we forgive others. Not to forgive is to turn away from the Lord who is Light and to remain in darkness.

In today's Gospel Jesus tells a parable about an unforgiving servant who refuses to forgive a fellow servant who owes him a small amount of money in

## comparison to the large amount that he himself owed to his employer. His debt was cancelled completely but he refused to do the same for his co-worker. The story does not have a happy ending. There are no winners in the end. Jesus concludes with a warning, "And that is how my heavenly Father will deal with you unless you forgive each other from your heart." In other words, the unforgiveable sin is to be unforgiving.

In the uncertain times in which we find ourselves to- day change is everywhere. Things we took for granted are no longer a certainty. We hear heart-breaking stories from families who were denied the opportunity to say goodbye to a loved one who was dying, to hold a hand and say, "I love you" or "I forgive you ". To-day's Gospel is a reminder that **NOW** is the time for forgiveness. Sr. Anne
