



Mr and Mrs X request the pleasure of your company at the marriage of their son with Miss Y, and afterwards at the wedding reception. Dress formal. So runs a standard invitation. And so begins the excitement. The date is highlighted on the calendar, the invitation is gratefully acknowledged, the shopping spree is arranged, the outfits, with matching accessories are purchased and all is ready for the special occasion



But this is not what happened in Matthew's account of a wedding in today's gospel. A king had to remind his guests twice of the wedding of his son. Those invited would not come. He pleaded with them, "Everything is ready. Come to the wedding." They were not interested. They had other places to go, some to their farms and others to their businesses. Others turned to violence, beating up and killing the messengers. Violence led to more violence. The king in anger retaliated by burning down their town.

In his determination to have a feast for his son he invited anyone he could find, the good and the bad. The wedding hall was eventually filled. But one unfortunate guest was thrown out. He was not wearing a wedding garment. Maybe it was lost in the fire in the town....

This is an unusual story. This is not the behaviour of the God that Jesus came to reveal. 


