
Clondalkin Village Parish Immaculate Conception & St. Killian Church

The Bible frequently uses variations of the image of the vine and the vineyard to express the relationship between God and His people. The Gospel of today provides us with a variation on the theme of the vineyard that is violent, tense, threatening! God has shown His loving care for His vineyard (His people) by transplanting them from Egypt to the fertile Promised Land. He has cultivated and protected His vineyard - His people. He couldn't have done more for them. Showing unbelievable patience, God, sent His Son as His representative, thinking the tenants would welcome Him. Instead they killed him!



This parable is a powerful indictment of the Jewish religious leaders to whom God had entrusted His people. In this parable Jesus makes a very forceful prediction of His own Passion. However, not even the murder of God's Son could thwart His plan for His vineyard – His people. Instead, God drew on other resources! His vineyard would be handed over to other tenants –pagan converts! By contrast they would welcome the Son and produce a bumper harvest.

The risk for us today is that we read the parable complacently, because it clearly refers to Jews and Christians in the first century. But it is not only in the past that the leadership of God's project has changed hands, so to speak. Down through history, more committed groups have challenged the established Church—they can attract by more exciting worship, by more mission focused out reach and by a closer living of the Gospel.

During these covid times there has been a number of issues heightened. As people have felt under pressure and are living with constant uncertainty and fear; How are we putting our faith in to action? Questions have been asked around how we are being church for others?



Covid-19 has made life extra difficult because of job losses, payments being made every two weeks instead of every week, more people eating at home and for many other reasons. Meanwhile bills stay the same and must still be paid.
