Catechism Course 2021 Clondalkin # 10 The Resurrection & Ascension

The Paschal mystery has two aspects: by his death Christ liberates us from sin, and by his resurrection he opens the way to us for eternal life.

"He descended into hell": 'Hell' here is *Sheol* in Hebrew- the place of the dead, rather than '*Gehenna*'-the place of fire and damnation. In his death Jesus conquered death and the devil "who has the power of death" (Heb 2:14). He opened the gates of Heaven for the just who had gone before him.

"On the third day he rose again": The Resurrection is a historical event which is attested to by the disciples, who really encountered the Risen Jesus. Christ, "the first-born from the dead" (*Col* 1:18), is the means by which we ourselves will be resurrected.

"He ascended into Heaven and is sitted at the right hand of the Father": In his Resurrection Christ rises from the dead, in his Ascension he enters heavenly glory. He returns to the Father with his human nature. Humanity is now a human side: humanity is brought into the Father's glory. We, as members of his Body, may hope to be with him for ever.
