




Taking a Moment to Look Back

VILLAGERS SENIOR GROUP

It is twenty years since the senior people of Clondalkin were told that Kelland Homes would be allocating a unit

to them within the Orchard Lodge block of apartments as agreed by the Planning Dept and SDCC. Over the years senior groups from different clubs have being trying to get these premises handed over from Kelland Homes without any success until last year, another group

consisting of people from different groups like Villagers Bridge, Tidy Towns, Active Age Older Voices, for change and formed a committee with two local County Councillors, Eoin O Brian and William Carey who worked

very hard on it. In the last two weeks we have had communication from Kelland Homes to tell us the legal ends are finalised and the premises has been handed over to SDCC. The next stage is to get it fitted out as it is just a shell with no heating, kitchen, bathrooms etc. We have

been told grants are available and that is the next project ahead. We will be looking for local help to get it up and running when all the construction is finished. I will keep you updated *Geraldine*
