# THE LORD IS MV SHEPHERD .....

Psalm 23 is the best known and most loved of the 150 psalms in the Book of Psalms. Composed by King David, who was himself a shepherd in his youth, it portrays God as a loving, caring shepherd and reveals the close relationship between God and David.

"The Lord is my shepherd. I lack nothing. He lets me lie down

in green pastures, leads me beside still waters, guides me on right paths and through deep canyons without harm. His rod and staff comfort me. A table is prepared for me, my head is anointed with oil, my cup overflows. I will live in God's house forever."

The setting of the psalm is the grazing area of the ancient Hebrews in a wilderness characterised by rugged canyons, sparse water sources, and dangerous predatory animals. The difficulty of the terrain made it dangerous to be without a shepherd who knew the watering holes, the right paths and the location of green pastures. A shepherd forms a close relationship with his sheep because of their helplessness in finding food and water or in protecting themselves. They need to stay close to the shepherd who leads them. Sheep do not follow with the eye but with the ear and that's where the rod and the staff come in. The shepherd taps the rocks on the path as he goes and the sheep know he is near. This is a way of being comforted. If it falls into a crevasse the hook on the staff is used to pull the sheep to safety.

Sheep are very timid and easily frightened by noise. The good shepherd leads them to green pastures where they can rest before taking them to still waters to drink. Leading them home he counts and checks them. After spending long hours in the

heat a sheep may be unwell. The shepherd anoints it's head with oil and massages it before resting overnight in the safety of the sheepfold.

This beautiful psalm reveals the kind, gentle care of Jesus, our Good Shepherd. Like sheep, we tend to wander and drift away seeking satisfaction where it cannot be found. On Good Shepherd Sunday we thank him for searching for and finding us when we are lost, for rejoicing over us and bringing us safely home with the prospect of living in God's house forever.








# Called to be YOU

Vocation Sunday set aside in the Church's calendar to encourage all of us think about our own vocation. So what is your vocation? You may think that you don't have a vocation or that vocations are the sort of thing clergy have. But if you think that, you're wrong. Each of us does have a vocation. God calls each one of us. The question, though, is to what? First and foremost, God calls us to change: to become more Christ-like. We are called to live out our lives in response to the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. That process began in our baptism, but it continues through prayer, through the reading of the scriptures and through the receiving of Holy Communion.



One of the constant themes in the New Testament is that lives touched by Christ were changed. What is true for the characters of the New Testament is true for us. As we encounter and respond to Christ we cannot help but be changed. But while we are called to change, we are also called to be more deeply ourselves. God never calls us to be something or someone we're not. God always calls us to what we are capable of becoming. It may be that there are parts of us which are underdeveloped or which rarely see the light of day which need to be allowed to flourish so we can be our true selves. It may be that we have hidden gifts which need to be discovered or it may be that there is



You have one life. For God's sake and for your own, live it.

something that we have secretly always wanted to do but have not had the courage or the time to try. Whatever it may be we need to find an outlet which will allow us to feel more excited about life or indeed to feel more alive.

St Irenaeus wrote that 'the glory of God is a human being fully alive'. Through the dual process of becoming more fully ourselves and of becoming more fully Christ-like, the will of God is fulfilled and the glory of God seen. That is what Vocations Sunday is about.
