

Parish Newsletter Sunday 4th April 2021



Our Easter message starts early in the morning, when Mary Magdalene was the first to go to the tomb and saw that stone was rolled away. I wonder what went through her mind while she was running back to get Peter and the others. Fear? Anger? Sadness? Hope? Once back at the tomb with them, they went inside the tomb and start to believe. For yet they did not understand what had happened – but they believed.

If we want to fully understand the Easter message of the Risen Lord, we have to go "inside the tomb". We have to go the extra mile with Jesus from Palm Sunday to Holy Thursday, from

Good Friday to Easter. Like on the day of our Baptism when we were baptised into the death and resurrection of our Lord we are now asked to go inside and "see" the empty tomb to start believing. What do you see when you go inside the empty tomb?

During the past twelve months we have been experiencing highs and lows, equivalent to Jesus' journey of Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Morning. The pandemic has taken its toll on many. As a church we have been mainly celebrating the Holy Thursday's memorial of "Do this in memory of me" behind closed doors in an empty Church. Only God knows when exactly the churches will be allowed to open to celebrate Eucharist again, with parishioners being present. The government is increasing the numbers of mourners for funerals by the end of the month. A small step but the Archbishop promised during the Chrism mass on Wednesday he

"...will continue to emphasise to Government the importance of the earliest possible return to the public worship, and that the easing of restrictions must not be subordinated to powerful commercial interests, even those considered "non-essential".

Archbishop Dermot Farrell also started the conversation we all have to have about the future of the Church:

#### What kind of church are we going to be post pandemic?

The Bishops of Ireland all agree that we cannot just open the doors and expect people to turn up. We should not and will not return to pre-Covid community of faith. Things have changed in the past twelve months. People in leadership of the Church have seen many challenges we are facing with decline mass attendance, mainly the older more vulnerable attending, declining numbers of priests, aging priests only to name a few. Archbishop Dermot Farrell and others are talking about "Synodality". Inspired by Pope Francis:

(The International Theological Commission, "Synodality in the Life and Mission of the Church", 9).

We are ALL inviting to take part in this synodal way. The entire leadership of the Church is asked to listen to what the baptised have to say. The task is to draw in many people to give the chance to speak and to be listened to and most importantly being heard without being judged or without given readymade answers. This new way of being a listening church does require humility and courage but it is the only way forward. But let us do it with hope in our hearts. We are indeed all in this together as a church of believers, followers of Christ.

"To be holy does not require being a bishop, a priest or a religious. (...) we are all called to be holy by living our lives with love and by bearing witness in everything we do, wherever we doing ourselves. (...) Let the grace of your Baptism bear fruit in a path of holiness. Let everything be open to God; turn to him in every situation."

(Gaudete Et Exsultate Rejoice and be Glad. Pope Francis, 15).

Together as the Baptised we are asked to share the message: The hope, the excitement, the love and the joy of the empty tomb. We have to be reenergised like Mary Magdalene and others to run to the empty tomb. We are all asked to go inside the tomb to see and to start believing. Like Mary Magdalene, Peter and others, we all are asked to share the Good News:

He Lord is Risen, Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia. Christina Malone, Parish Pastoral Worker
