#### Become what you Receive...

Every time we celebrate the Eucharist, we are remembering in a sacred and profound way the Life, Death and Resurrection of Jesus; the Paschal Mystery. This is not some distant, one-time, re-enacted drama at which we are silent and passive observers. The Church document on the liturgy calls us to be *Full*, *Conscious* and *Active* participants in the celebration of the Eucharist at all times.

During the celebration of the Eucharist the simplest human food transforms, and transforms those who eat it, into the

Body of the Christ. The Eucharist gives us the gift it signifies, the risen Jesus alive again in our midst. We present the most ordinary of things to God; bread and wine; fruit of the earth and work of our hands. God accepts, blesses them and then through the power of the Holy Spirit they become the Body and Blood of Jesus. God then surprises us even more and returns these new gifts to us out of love. The Eucharist is an expression God's ultimate bountiful generosity. Our response can only be gratitude which is why when we receive the Body and Blood of Jesus, we prayerfully respond, Amen. May we never take this greatest of gifts for granted. We didn't earn it, it's not our right and we can't demand it. It is God's gift given freely out love to each of us. As Pope Francis reminds us; 'The Eucharist is not a prize for the perfect, but a powerful medicine and nourishment form the weak.' (The Joy of the Gospel: 47).

This wonderful feast also calls us to remember and become who we are: we are the Church, the Body of Christ. St. Augustine said, 'Believe what you see, see what you believe and become what you are: the Body of Christ. When you say 'Amen' we are saying, 'Yes, I believe that this is Body and Blood of Jesus and that I will become the Body of Christ to others.' At the meal we call the Last Supper during which he first offered himself to us through the breaking of bread and pouring of wine, he asked that when whenever we do this we are to do it in memory of him. This first Eucharist was a moment of particular intimacy, between Jesus and His disciples. It involved; gathering around a table, talking & listening, giving & receiving; word, bread, wine and washing of feet. The whole event was communion not just the moments of breaking and blessing bread & wine.

Jesus took the place of slave, washed our feet and asked us to do the same for each other; we are to serve each other. If we celebrate the Body and Blood of Jesus in memory of Jesus, we are also to serve each other in memory of Jesus. We cannot do one without doing the other!

# We have learnt so much during this pandemic and many have suffered so much. We have been exiled from our 'normal' lives for the last fifteen months. We were deprived and mourned not being able to gather around the altar as a community of faith to be nourished and celebrate at our eucharistic celebration. The safe return to the celebration of the Eucharist with a congregation has been heartening. We had to suspend sacramental preparation and celebrations. There is much work being done in parishes to address this safely and if discussions on Joe Duffy this week were a measure, we still have a lot to do. But what was really being mourned or missed? Was it the event, the date, the occasion, the tradition, the expected celebration? Or, throughout this most difficult of times, did we continue to **BE** communion/Eucharist for each other? The event may come to an end, but the communion continues..., always.

On this feast of Corpus Christi may we recommit to becoming what we have received. May we enter into and witness to this loving mystery. By receiving Christ's body, blood, soul, and divinity in the Eucharist, may our minds be enlightened, our hearts be strengthened, and like the apostles may we be renewed in spirit to go out into our world as missionary disciples of the Lord. *Have a great week!*


#### **LOUGH DERG 2021**



#### **WORLD FOOD SAFETY DAY 2021**

World Food Safety Day (WFSD) celebrated on 7 June 2021 aims to draw attention and inspire action to help prevent, detect and manage foodborne risks, contributing to food security, human health, economic prosperity, agriculture, market access, tourism and sustainable development. This year's theme, 'Safe food today for a healthy tomorrow', stresses that production and consumption of safe food has immediate and long-term benefits for people, the planet and the economy. Recognizing the systemic connections between the health of people, animals, plants, the environment and the economy will help us meet the needs of the future. Recognizing the global burden of foodborne diseases,



which affect individuals of all ages, in particular children under-5 and persons living in low-income countries, the United Nations General Assembly proclaimed in 2018 that every 7 June would be World Food Safety Day. In 2020, the World Health Assembly further adopted a decision on strengthening efforts on food safety to reduce the burden of foodborne disease. Food safety is a shared responsibility between governments, producers and consumers. Through the World Food Safety Day, WHO works to mainstream food safety in the public agenda and reduce the burden of foodborne diseases globally. Food safety is everyone's business.
