

# FEEDING THE FIVE THOUSAND

The feeding of the crowds in the wilderness seems notably straightforward. Jesus was moved by compassion for the crowds and healed them. Late in the day, the disciples assessed the situation (in the wilderness there is nothing for the hungry crowds to eat) and perhaps they, too, were moved by compassion when they suggested the crowds be sent to nearby towns



Jesus didn't wait for anyone else. He didn't say "It's someone else's problem!" or "The government should be doing more!" – He reacted to their need there and then. He, also, didn't go all *miraculous* and do it all on his own (it definitely wasn't a how great am I moment) but got his disciples involved right at the heart of his compassionate response. His compassionate actions and response inspired others. Never underestimate how your works of kindness and compassion (no matter how insignificant you think they are) can and do inspire others.

I wonder if the "miracle" of the feeding is not so much what Jesus does as what happens among the crowds in the presence of Jesus and the witness of the disciples. Maybe the crowds experienced the transformative power of Christ's presence when he invited them to make themselves comfortable on the grass, as if they were honoured guests at a meal. And when he blessed the loaves, the crowd sensed this meal was

special. The disciples responded to Jesus' witness. His compassion was contagious. They, without question or moan, walked through the hungry crowd and spread compassion. Not as platitudes but as a real, timely, appropriate and practical response to a real need. And there was an abundance! Perhaps as the disciples moved through the crowds distributing the food, no one feared there wouldn't be enough, and so they didn't think of themselves and their own needs. The men shared with their wives and sisters and mothers, and the children were fed first. Jesus' compassion was contagious in the way they cared for each other. And Jesus' healing touch inspired them to gratitude for a simple meal abundant by wilderness standards. Conceivably the most profound thing Jesus does in the story is to insist that the disciples imagine possibilities for distributing food for a hungry crowd so that there is enough for everyone. Do we take the opportunities to "share my food" so others will have enough? Do we even notice the needs of those around us? Are our actions one's of compassion and kindness that inspires others to witness to their faith? Maybe this week do at least one conscious act of kindness, compassion to alleviate the suffering of others. And, if you are suffering yourself, trust in the compassion of others, know you do not journey alone, take the risk and reach out. God bless and have a great week,

#### Corona Virus Prayer



#### INTERNATIONAL DAY OF FRIENDSHIP 2021

The International Day of Friendship was **proclaimed** in 2011 by the UN General Assembly with the idea that friendship between peoples, countries, cultures and individuals can inspire peace efforts and build bridges between communities. To mark the International Day of Friendship the UN encourages governments, international organizations and civil society groups to hold events, activities and initiatives that contribute to the efforts of the international community towards promoting a dialogue among civilizations, solidarity, mutual understanding and reconciliation. The International Day of Friendship is an initiative that follows on the proposal made by UNESCO defining the Culture of Peace as a set of values, attitudes and behaviours that reject violence and endeavour to prevent conflicts by addressing their root causes with a view to solving problems. It was then adopted by the UN General Assembly in 1997.




