As we return to Mark (7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23) we find ourselves in yet another story of conflict between Jesus and his opponents. Here the Pharisees are reprimanding the followers of Jesus for not engaging in ritual washing before they eat. This is an example of a tradition handed down in Pharisee circles which had come to have the full force of the written Law. Jesus has little time for their legalism and guotes from Isaiah to make his point. This is only lip service to God who does not care about their external observances but who desires a true worship of the heart. A person cannot be made unclean by external factors, e.g. the failure to observe purely religious ritual; rather we are made unclean by that which comes from within, from our hearts, the source of our moral action.

If a survey were to be conducted among churchgoers in which they were asked for a definition of religion it is unlikely that many would come up with the simple answer provided by James (Second Reading from the Letter of St. James). Coming to the help of orphans and widows would be for many a kind of agreeable by-product of religion whereas James places it right at the Clondalkin: centre of who we are and what we do. This is surely a message for today when so many people go to such great lengths in their search for wisdom and the knowledge of God. A religion that can be observed at a purely external level has a certain appeal. It is easy to feel we are making progress and that we are better than those who do not measure up. We imagine that by our own efforts we can come close to God. However, Jesus wants no part in such a sham. He is concerned with the heart and a faith that does justice.


Archdiocese of Dublin Ard Deoise Átha Gliath



MONDAY 31st AUGUST - GRIEF AWARENESS DAY

Sometimes even the brightest of days can be dark when the difficulties of life rear their ugly heads. But there is a silver lining to this, there are those that are willing to help us through these darker days. This is all about looking at grief, and raising awareness both of how to cope with grief, and how to help others cope. So look around and offer that helping hand, lend an ear and join us on Grief Awareness Day to show those around us that we are here for them. To truly understand how to help people, including yourself, cope with grief, sometimes it is best to try and understand exactly what grief is. It is usually in response to the loss of someone or something important in your life. Many times bonds of affection or love exist that make it that much harder to cope with influx of emotions. Yet many of us forget the cognitive, social and philosophical difficulties that can come from losing someone close to us. Many believe in the five stages of grief, and helping someone go through those stages can be more important than anything during difficult times of grief.

First is the stage of denial, where they do not believe the reason for the grief has even occurred. Just being there during the time they are going through this stage is all that is needed; indeed many people go through this stage when reminded about anything to deal with the grief.

Second is the stage of anger, where the one grieving lashes out at anyone and anything around it. Be careful around those in this stage, as occasionally physical manifestations of grief occur here in very violent forms.

Third is the stage of bargaining, where they are focused more on a belief or what if statements and ideals. The difficulty with guilt can be a hallmark here, but just being there helps many cope with this. The fourth stage is depression. This is the moment when they know the grief is real, and it hits them hard. This is not to say

This is not to say they were not depressed before over the situation, but this is when the depression really comes to the forefront. This moment can be very hard to deal with, but helping them by reminding them of the good things can help as much as being there for them.

The final stage is acceptance, and this is where they are looking forward, not only back. They will likely never forget, but they will move forward, able to return to normal after a fashion.

These stages are not fully linear; we don't always go through them once and are done. We can bounce between them for minutes, hours, days or even months. Each person is different, as is their methods of grief and coping with the various stages.



The International Eucharistic Congress is a gathering of people every four years, somewhere in the world, which aims to promote an awareness of the central place of the Eucharist in the life and mission of the Catholic Church; to help improve our understanding and celebration of the liturgy and to draw attention to the social dimension of the Eucharist. These aims are achieved through a programme of pastoral preparation in the lead up to the Congress and a programme of liturgical and cultural events, lectures and workshops throughout Congress week.
Hungary last hosted the International Eucharistic Congress in 1938. The theme of IEC2021 is 'AII My Springs are in You'. It is taken from Psalm 87 and refers to God as the source (or spring) of life for his people. In 2012 the 50th International Eucharistic Congress took place in Dublin on the theme, 'The Eucharist: Communion with Christ and with One Another'. Ireland hosted the 31st Congress in 1932 which coincided with the 1500th anniversary of Saint Patrick's arrival in Ireland.

Grant us, that the time of the preparation and the celebration of the Eucharistic Congress would serve the spiritual renewal of our community, cities, nation, Europe and the world!



St Gregory the Great (540-604) Monk and Pope

Feast Day 3rd September

Pope and Doctor of the Church. Born about 540; died in Rome in 604, he founded monasteries in Rome and in Sicily. Called to be a deacon of Rome by Benedict I,

then sent as Papal Legate to Constantinople, he was elected Pope in 590AD. He reorganised Church life and administration in a time of crisis, sponsored



liturgical reform, and initiated the evangelisation of the English. Known also for his extensive writings on pastoral care, spirituality, and morals, and for his self-designation as "servant of the servants of God." Only two other Popes, both saints, are called "the Great" – Leo I (440-461) and Nicholas I (858-867). Gregory saw himself as the leader of a Christian society, "God's consul", as the epitaph on his tombstone says.
