





The smallest finger reminds you to pray for yourself. When you have prayed for the other four groups, you will be able to see your own needs, but from the proper perspective.


PRAYING FOR VOCATIONS

Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross (Edith Stein) 1891-1942

Feast Day 9th August

"We bow down before the testimony of the life and death of Edith Stein, an outstanding daughter of Israel and at the



same time a daughter of the Carmelite Order, Sister Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, a personality who united within her rich life a dramatic synthesis of our century. It was the synthesis of a history full of deep wounds that are still hurting ... and also the synthesis of the full truth about man. All this came together in a single heart that remained restless and unfulfilled until it finally found rest in God."

These were the words of Pope John Paul II when he beatified Edith Stein in Cologne on 1 May 1987.

Just take everything exactly as it is, put it in God's hands and leave it with Him. Then you will be able to rest in Him - really rest - and start the next day as a new life.


PATHWAYS: EXPLORING FAITH AS AN ADULT
