

Monday 4th October is the feast of St. Francis of Assisi. Francis was born into a well-to-do family in the town of Assisi in 1181. Francis enjoyed a privileged life as a child and young man. Like many saints throughout history, Francis



experienced an important conversion moment in life.

Having renounced all his worldly possessions and ambitions he began to live a very simple life of poverty, relying on the goodness of people for his food and wellbeing. He gathered some like-minded men around him and, when their numbers began to grow steadily, Francis travelled to Rome to seek papal approval to found his religious order, the Order of Friars Minor. They devoted themselves to a very basic style of living and to the care of the poor.

Francis is renowned for his love of nature and his ability to recognise the presence of God in the beauty of creation. His appreciation for the natural environment is an encouragement to those concerned about Parishnewsletter1@gmail.com global warming and climate change today. For the last years of his life

Francis carried the stigmata, the crucifixion wounds of Jesus, on his body. Francis died in 1226 and is buried in his home town of Assisi.

One of the legacies of St. Francis that survives to the present day is the Christmas crib. Francis is credited with creating the first crib as a way of presenting the story of the Nativity of Jesus to the people in a visual way. Francis also inspired St. Clare, herself a native of Assisi, to found a similar religious order for women who are now known to us as the Poor Clares. The work of St. Francis continues today in the world-wide Franciscan family who continue to live his charism of caring for the poor and needy. Probably the best example of this for many of us is the work of Br. Kevin in the Capuchin Day Centre in Dublin.

Bruno was born in Cologne, Germany, became a famous teacher at Rheims, and was appointed chancellor of the archdiocese at the age of 45. He supported Pope Gregory VII in his fight against the decadence of the clergy, and took part in the removal of his own scandalous archbishop, Manasses. Bruno suffered the plundering of his house for his pains.



He had a dream of living in solitude and prayer, and persuaded a few friends to join him in a hermitage. After a while he felt the place unsuitable and through a friend, was given some land which was to become famous for his foundation "in the Chartreuse"—from which comes the word Carthusians. The climate, desert, mountainous terrain, and inaccessibility guaranteed silence, poverty, and small numbers.

Bruno and his friends built an oratory with small individual cells at a distance from each other. They met for Matins and Vespers each day and spent the rest of the time in solitude, eating together only on great feasts. Their chief work was copying manuscripts.

Hearing of Bruno's holiness, the Pope called for his assistance in Rome. When the Pope had to flee Rome, Bruno pulled up stakes again, and after refusing a bishopric, spent his last years in the wilderness of Calabria.
Bruno was never formally canonized, because the Carthusians were averse to all occasions of publicity.
However, Pope Clement X extended his feast to the whole Church in 1674.

'LISTEN" Vatican Announces Theme for **World Communications Day 2022**

Pope Francis has chosen the single word, "Listen!" as the theme for the 56th World Communications Day, which will be celebrated in 2022. Announcing next year's theme, the Holy See says, "Pope Francis is asking the world to listen again."



After the Message of 2021, which focused on going and seeing, in his new Message for World Communications Day 2022 Pope Francis asks the world of communication to learn to listen again. The pandemic has affected and wounded everyone, and everyone needs to be heard and comforted. Listening is also fundamental for good information. The search for truth begins with listening. And so does witnessing through the means of social communication. Every dialogue, every relationship begins with listening. For this reason, in order to grow, even professionally, as communicators, we need to relearn to listen a lot.

Jesus himself asks us to pay attention to how we listen (cf. Lk 8:18). To be able to truly listen requires courage, and a free and open heart, without prejudice.

At this time when the whole Church is invited to listen in order to learn to be a synodal Church, we are all invited to rediscover listening as essential for good communication.

Different types of days have been created in honor of teachers all over the world. The idea became popular back in the 19th century when various local educators were

honored. They may have happened on various dates but they have one thing in common: the celebration and appreciation of teachers. Putting all of this together, UNESCO (The United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization) proclaimed that the first World Teachers' Day would be celebrated on October 5, 1994.
