

It's just a week since I arrived to take up my new appointment in Clondalkin Parish. It has been a busy week of meeting new people, trying to find my way around, unpacking boxes and getting the house set up, being introduced to the complexities of parish life in Clondalkin and some of the issues that will require my attention in due course.

By way of introduction I might begin by saying that I was born in Dublin and grew up in Dundrum. After my Leaving Certificate I studied for the priesthood in Holy Cross College Clonliffe, in UCD and in St. Patrick's College Maynooth. I was ordained a



For a priest, change means leaving what one is familiar with behind. It means packing up and moving to pastures new, opening oneself to new experiences, forming new relationships, gaining new insights and ministering to new people in a new place. It can be Parish Office Hours difficult to move from where one is settled and comfortable. There can be uncertainty, a little anxiousness, and a concern as to whether one will be able to minister effectively in a different setting.

Despite all the elements of change, the work of a priest remains essentially the same no matter where he is appointed. It entails preaching the Gospel, celebrating the Eucharist, being there with people at significant moments as they experience both the happy and sad events of life, and helping people to recognise the presence and action of God in their lives.

I begin my ministry in Clondalkin parish in a spirit of trust and hope. I trust that the Lord will be with me and provide me with the graces I will need to meet the challenges that lie

ahead. I hope that my ministry will be effective in that it will bring the presence of Jesus in all kinds of ways to touch people's lives. I ask you to remember me in your prayers.

Together, let us work to support the Catholic faith community here in Clondalkin. Let us continue to witness to the faith that has been lived and handed on in this parish over very many years. Let us ensure that we leave a legacy of Christian example for those who will come after us. May the Lord bless and be with us in our endeavours. May Mary, Mother of the Church, watch over us all and intercede for us with Jesus, her son and our Saviour.

The International Eucharistic Congress is a gathering of people every four years, somewhere in the world, which aims to promote an awareness of the central place of the Eucharist in the life and mission of the Catholic Church; to help improve our understanding and celebration of the liturgy and to draw attention to the social dimension of the Eucharist. These aims are achieved through a programme of pastoral preparation in the lead up to the Congress and a programme of liturgical and cultural events, lectures and workshops throughout Congress week.

Hungary last hosted the International Eucharistic Congress in 1938. The theme of IEC2021 is 'All My Springs are in You'. It is taken from Psalm 87 and refers to God as the source (or spring) of life for his people.

In 2012 the 50th International Eucharistic Congress took place in Dublin on the theme, 'The Eucharist: Communion with Christ and with One Another'. Ireland hosted the 31st Congress in 1932 which coincided with the 1500th anniversary of Saint Patrick's arrival in Ireland.

The Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary St. Ciaran, Abbot (Clonmacnoise) St. Peter Claver, Priest

St Ciaran of Clonmacnoise, Abbot (6th Century)

Memorial - 9th September

St. Ciarán was born around 512. His father was a travelling carpenter called Beoit and his mother was called Darerca.



Ciarán was born and reared in an area that is in the present-day Roscommon. He had a number of brothers and sisters. Some of them also entered the religious life. As a young boy, Ciarán helped his family herd cattle and studied his lessons while out in the fields. When he was older, he went to study with St. Finian at Clonard, which is in modern-day Meath. He later studied on Aran with St. Enda, and later with Senan of Scattery Island where he was ordained a priest. After spending time in various monasteries, Ciarán eventually founded his monastery at Clonmacnoise in January of 544. Clonmacnoise later became one of the most influential monasteries in Europe. Alcuin of York (735-804), the most renowned of Saxon scholars who became an advisor at the court of Charlemagne, studied here under Colcu the Wise in the eighth century. He wrote letters to him and sent presents from himself and the emperor. The monastery survived the Viking raids and the Norman wars up until 1552.



"This pastoral letter, which I have titled, The Cry of the Earth, the Cry of The Cry of the Earth the Poor, approaches the climate catastrophe from the perspective of faith. That is not to say, it excludes the insights and contribution of the natural sciences. On the contrary, healthy faith takes on board what God says through creation (see Dei Verbum §3). Faith and science are not opponents; in a truly Christian view, faith and reason - fides et ratio - go hand in hand. God reveals himself through the world. That is the heart of our Catholic faith. Scientists have issued a "code red" not just for the environment, but for humanity itself. God now calls us, individually and collectively, to work for the good of the planet and the good of all. Let us not fool ourselves: there can be no enduring response to the cry of the earth without responding to the need for justice and dignity."
