Today we continue Luke's Gospel on his sermon on the plain. The Gospel today celebrates Jesus as the Lord of love and compassion. How can we honestly be his followers if we are still bearing grudges against others? Let us pray that he will free us from those feelings that keep us away from Jesus and keep us from being the best we can be. In recent weeks you might have heard in the media that Pope Francis has called an international synod on

"For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission". With this convocation, Pope Francis invites the entire Church to reflect on a theme that is decisive for its life and mission: It is precisely this path of synodality which God expects of the Church of the third millennial."

In recent years the Pope has called a number of those synods, for example: one on the family (2014/2015) and one on young people (2018). After gathering local voices, Pope Francis holds a gathering in Rome (attended by Cardinals, Bishops, Religious, lay people) before writing a "letter" (encyclical) as a response. In 2016 he wrote "Amoris Laetitia – the Joy the Love" and in 2019 "Christus Vivit - Christ is alive". With calling a Synod on "Synodality", Pope Francis' hopes are, that the Church is going to be a "listening church" (synodal Church). Monday-Friday : 9.30-12.30 One that is mutual to everyone's voice

Being a synodal Church: The practice of living as a synodal Church means:

- The conversations lead to conversion to Christ and commitment to active participation in the mission given by Christ - Communion
- The people of God talk with one another and listen to one another about questions that matter — Participation

 The communion exists for a common purpose; mission flows naturally from the experience of communion — Mission.

Over recent months, Kieran and Anneta Maguire, two faithful parishioners, have attended the diocesan Animator training and over the next few weeks you will hear more about what the parish is going to offer for your voice to be heard. STATEMENT OF MISSION

The great social, cultural and religious change of our time brings challenges and opportunities for all people—both for people of faith and for people who do not see themselves in this way. In response, the Archdiocese of Dublin is initiating a process of review and renewal, and is providing a Statement of Mission as a starting point for reflection and conversation in each parish and in the diocese as a whole. Mission

Encounter with the person of Jesus makes us who we are, and shapes what we do. Being at the service of this encounter is the heart of our mission. The living Christ calls and empowers the Dublin Archdiocese to act with resolve and become more fully a place of welcome and compassion, which embodies the power, hope and joy of the gospel.

Vision

- Across the Archdiocese we build up together:
 - Communities that are faith-filled
 - Communities of co-responsibility through servant leadership
 - Communities that are active in social justice and
 - Communities of welcome and inclusion

We are called to develop new ways to accompany the people of our time. This will require new thinking and a shift of mind-set in everyone.

Within the reality of our cultural, social and church context, we must create new possibilities for mission:

- Supporting people to deepen their faith and relationship with God
- Creating the structures that support vibrant communities of faith, and

Advocating for those who are on the margins Aware of the need for responsible stewardship, and of the diminishing resources available of time, talent and treasure, we are invited into an ongoing process of prayerful dialogue, discernment and decision making, concerning our missionary priorities.
