CHURCH OF THE APOSTLES

Down through the centuries there has often been much hankering after the church that we read of in "Acts of the Apostles". The infant church was and indeed still is seen by some as being almost perfect – simple, down to earth, loving God and loving neighbour in the way Jesus meant it to be. Then it got contaminated with complexity, hierarchy, dogmas, doctrines, power structures, ceremony, etc. Many have tried to recapture this golden age of the church by establishing their own church modelled on what they read in the Acts of the Apostles. But the outcome has always been further fragmentation as it is based on a misreading of what the Scripture actually tells us about the early church.

What is very clear is that it had its origins in weakness and not strength, in frailty and not perfection. The Acts of the Apostles is about the Apostles and in the Gospels we often find that they were an exasperating lot. But perhaps that is a large part of what makes them believable and human. At the beginning of Jesus' public ministry it was easier for them to believe in him as the long awaited Messiah. He was enormously popular as he drew people to him with his teaching, his powers of healing and even his power over nature. But as time goes on and Jesus gradually revealed who he was and warns them that he faced crucifixion and death, the cracks began to appear.

The Apostles squabble among themselves about who is the greatest, they have doubts and fears. They began to wonder who this man really is now that his popularity is tainted by the increasing hostility of the Pharisees. Maybe this Jesus is just a little bit too dangerous to be associated with. What is all this talk about suffering and death and then three days later living again? When their doubts begin to overwhelm them he gives them a shot in the arm to help them as in the Transfiguration and the raising of Lazarus. It all gives a picture of the Apostles as a very mixed bunch – a true reflection of the human condition and a true reflection of the early church we read about in the Acts of the Apostles. They were sinners who

became saints. Their mission to teach the whole world about Jesus grew out of weakness, not strength, came to fulfilment out of frailty not perfection. St Paul tells us that God's Grace is sufficient in our weakness for when we are weak then we are strong. What that means for us 2000 years later is that the more inadequate we feel in living the Christian life, the more God fills us up and makes up for our weaknesses as he did with the Apostles.

The Spirit comes to us in our weakness and we pray for His presence among us as we bring the good news of Jesus in what we say, what we do and most significantly in the example we set.

St. Conleth (450-519) *Feast Day* 4th *May*

We do not know where Conleth was born or who his parents were, but we do know from Cogitosus's *Life of Brigid* (c. 650) that he was a skilled metal-worker in gold and silver who lived as a hermit at Old Connell on the Liffey near Newbridge. He had the reputation of being a very holy man with the gift of prophecy. He is also said to have been the sculptor of the crozier of St Finbar of Termonbarry,

Co Roscommon.

The tradition is that Brigid invited him not only to make sacred vessels for her foundation but also to be pastor of the people nearby. Cogitosus says that they governed the church at Kildare "by means of a mutually happy alliance". And so Conleth is regarded as the first bishop of Kildare

appointed 490. After about twenty years as bishop, Conleth set out on a pilgrimage to Rome. Because he was now an old man Saint Brigid feared for him going on this journey. Somewhere on the journey in Ireland Conleth was attacked and killed by wolves, which at that time lived in the woods and mountains of Leinster. A gloss in an Irish martyrology saying he was devoured by wolves on his journey to Rome undertaken against the wishes of Brigid may be an attempt to explain his name, i.e. *coin* 'wolves' and *leth* 'half'.

Saint Conleth died on the 3rd May 519 AD. The tradition in Kildare holds that he was buried on the left side of the altar in the Church of Ireland cathedral in Kildare town and Saint Brigid on the right. The tradition in Newbridge holds that he was buried in the Old Connell graveyard. An alternative version is that his relics were transferred there in 835 to protect the inhabitants from Danish invaders. He is the patron saint of the parish of Droichead Nua (Newbridge), Co Kildare.

A water garden dedicated to St Conleth designed as a contemplative space and constructed by Martin O'Neill, "Crookedwood", is situated on the left hand side of the parish church in Newbridge. It contains a bronze statue of St Conleth by Annette McCormack carrying on his shoulders a child holding up a St Brigid's cross.

WORLD PRESS FREEDOM DAY - 3rd May 2022

This year's World Press Freedom Day theme "Journalism under digital siege," spotlights the multiple ways in which journalism is endangered by surveillance and digitallymediated attacks on journalists, and the consequences of all this on public trust in digital communications World Press Freedom Day was proclaimed by the UN General Assembly in December 1993, following the recommendation of UNESCO's General Conference. Since then, 3rd May, the anniversary of the <u>Declaration of</u> <u>Windhoek</u> is celebrated worldwide as World Press Freedom Day. After 30 years, the historic connection made between the

freedom to seek, impart and receive information and the public good remains as relevant as it was at the time of its signing. Special commemorations of the 30th anniversary are planned to take place during World Press Freedom Day International Conference.

May 3rd acts as a reminder to governments of the need to respect their commitment to press freedom. It is also a day of reflection among media professionals about issues of press freedom and professional ethics. It is an opportunity to:

- celebrate the fundamental principles of press freedom;
- assess the state of press freedom throughout the world;
- defend the media from attacks on their independence and pay tribute to journalists who have lost their lives in the line of duty.
- The conference will reunite relevant policymakers, journalists, media representatives, activists, policy makers in Internet companies, cybersecurity managers, AI researchers and legal experts from around the world to explore the digital era's impact on freedom of expression and the safety of journalists, media viability and public trust.
