THE WAY OF THE DISCIPLE

In today's three readings we hear of God's preference for the nobodies of this world. In the first reading the prophet Zephaniah speaks of the humble and the lowly, those who find refuge and shelter in the Lord.

In the second reading Paul warns the Christians at Corinth not to become puffed up with their own wisdom because God has a habit of choosing the weak and foolish by human standards. He uses "those who are nothing at all to show up those who are everything".

In our Gospel reading Matthew gives us the jewel of his gospel – the beatitudes, which celebrate the actions of the little people whose lives illumine the Gospel.

Matthew considers the effects the beatitudes should have in the life of a follower of Christ. It is not poverty as such that entitles one to enter the kingdom, but the fact of being poor in spirit, able to recognise one's own fragility and the illusory support of human nature and therefore put everything into God's hand and trust Him. The gentle are those who are patient with the kind of people that others write off as hopeless cases. The mourners mourn for the amount of evil and violence in the world and mourn over sin in their own lives. The hungry are those who hunger and thirst for justice in an unjust world of poverty and greed.

The disciples who show mercy will have mercy shown to them and the pure

of heart and mind will see God. Those who make peace with others will merit the title "Children of God" and those who are persecuted for their faith will merit the Kingdom of God.

The best commentary on the beatitudes, the happy attitudes, is Jesus' own life. "Learn from me" He says to his disciples. The question we ask of ourselves and of others is

"Where do I see these happy attitudes in myself or in others?"
