DEATH OF A FRIEND

Lazarus and his sisters, Martha and Mary were special friends of Jesus. Jesus loved all three of them. Their home in Bethany, near Jerusalem, was always open to him.

One day while Jesus was in an area near the Jordan he received a message from the sisters that Lazarus was ill. Jesus was expected to return but it was day four before he returned and Lazarus in the meantime died. Martha's first words to him were "What took you so long?"

In the Gospel of John, this is not the first time Jesus delayed and did nothing before he did something. At the wedding feast in Cana his mother told him there wasn't enough wine and he implied that he wasn't going to do anything. At the feeding of the five thousand, Jesus knew what he was going to do but he asked his disciples what they thought they should do. Shortly before his death, his relatives asked him if he was going to the Feast in Jerusalem. He gave them the feeling that he wasn't, but went later.

We see the same pattern in today's gospel. He delayed returning to Bethany and when he finally arrived, he found that Lazarus was already four days in the tomb. Burial had taken place and days of mourning followed. Martha and Mary grieved that Jesus, despite being a close family friend, was not there when they needed him. They both expressed the same feelings, "Lord, if you had been here my brother would not have died." The neighbours put it more forcefully, "Could not he who opened the eyes of the blind man kept this man from dying?"

Martha believed and her faith in him deepened, "I believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God." Her sister Mary knelt at his feet in reverence. Jesus publicly expressed his belief in and gratitude to the Father, "I thank you, Father, for having heard me. I know that you always hear me." Lazarus was given the gift of life.

The people present believed in Jesus.

The next time you say that your prayer to the Lord went unanswered, recall this gospel story.



Cherokee Indian proverb



Pope urges renewed consecration of Ukraine and **Russia to Mary**

Speaking during his weekly General Audience in St Peter's Square on Wednesday (22nd March), Pope Francis urged believers to renew the consecration of humanity especially Russia and Ukraine - to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Pope Francis' initial consecration of Russia and Ukraine to



Mary's Immaculate Heart (on 25th March 2022) was a response, he said, to the war between the two countries. "This is no magic formula," he explained at the time, "but a spiritual act. It is an act of complete trust on the part of children who, amid the tribulation of this cruel and senseless war that threatens our world, turn to their Mother, reposing all their fears and pain in her heart and abandoning themselves to her." This Wednesday, the Pope said that "My thoughts go to the 25th March of last year, when, in union with all the bishops of the world, I consecrated the Church and humanity, especially Russia and Ukraine, to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. "Let us not tire of consecrating the cause of peace to the Queen of Peace," he continued. "I would like to invite every believer and community, especially prayer groups, to renew the Act of Consecration to Our Lady every 25th March, so that she, who is Mother, might preserve us all in unity and peace." The Pope ended his appeal by remembering "tormented Ukraine", as he has at almost every General Audience since the outbreak of war, and

urged his listeners never to forget the country, which, he

said, "is suffering very greatly."
