What chapter of Your life's story do you find yourself in today, this Eastertide?

Where has Your journey with the Risen One taken You thus far?

We hear in John's Gospel today about the locked doors ... and fear of ... and we may just find ourselves in a similar space/place. The reason for fear is named here. Fear even after Jesus' Resurrection! We may not know too much about fear ourselves, how it may affect us inside out. If I know what I fear and can name it, I can be assured that the Lord knows too and nothing stops Him from entering into my life if I wait with expectation. The disciples knew a thing or two about fear. Haven't they heard Mary of Magdala's testimony? Wasn't the encounter on the road to Emmaus just freshly shared on their lips? Weren't their hearts burning within? Just like Yours and mine?

Something may have happened to some of us since the Resurrection morning. As the saying goes, life happens. Someone may have shut the door for You as You were about to open it. Maybe some of us have felt like Thomas for some time now and just whisper – *unless I see, unless I touch, unless I experience!*

He just happened not to be there when Jesus came. It doesn't matter where he was or why he wasn't there. Jesus knew what Thomas needed.

St. Laserian - Feast Day 18th April

Laserian was the son of Cairel de Blitha and Gemma, a Scottish princess and may have spent his early years in Scotland. He was also said to have been a disciple of St Munnu.

He is said to have spent fourteen years in Rome and studied under St Gregory the Great, who ordained him and sent him back to Ireland. At any rate, he was a strong proponent of the Roman method of calculating Easter. When he came back to Ireland, he took over an already established monastery from St Gobban at Leighlin, Co Carlow. Leighlin then became a strong centre of support of the Roman method of calculation.

Laserian died in the year 639.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

In a series of revelations to St. Maria Faustina Kowalska in the 1930s, our Lord called for a special feast day to be celebrated on the Sunday after Easter. Today, we know that feast as Divine Mercy Sunday, named by St. John Paul II at the canonization of St. Faustina on 30th April 2000.

The Lord expressed His will with regard to this feast in His very first revelation to St. Faustina. The message of The Divine Mercy is simple. It is that God loves us – all of us. And, he wants us to recognize that His mercy is greater than our sins, so that we will call upon Him with trust, receive His mercy, and let it flow through us to others.

Thus, all will come to share His joy.

The Divine Mercy message is one we can call to mind simply by remembering ABC:

- **A** - Ask for His Mercy. God wants us to approach Him in prayer constantly, repenting of our sins and asking Him to pour His mercy out upon us and upon the whole world.
- **B** - Be merciful. God wants us to receive His mercy and let it flow through us to others. He wants us to extend love and forgiveness to others just as He does to us.
- **C** - Completely trust in Jesus. God wants us to know that the graces of His mercy are dependent upon our trust. The more we trust in Jesus, the more we will receive.
