The Gospel presents Jesus as the guide in life, the 'way, truth and life'. The Christian centre is the person of Christ. Our work for Jesus and our love for people, no matter what our calling in life, flow from this. Mother Teresa was once asked why she did what she did, and she simply said 'for Jesus'. This centre always holds, it cannot be unhinged. It is a deeply personal relationship: we are led by



Jesus 'one by one', known by name, not as one of a group.

We follow him as one we know, not a stranger. We study his life and times, getting to know the places and events of his life, we become familiar with the Gospels and get to know him in the heart. Prayer is the way of keeping our centre of conviction and motivation strong. Freedom grows and we begin to find him

everywhere.

Different types of people and spirituality stress different aspects of Jesus. The Eastern approach to Jesus is very much the 'way'; while the African is the 'life'. The European stress is the 'truth'. In Europe we need to rediscover also the joy and vibrancy of the African and Latin American expressions of faith, and also the presence of God in all life's moods and journeys of the Indian and Eastern traditions. We can get so caught up in small or even big truths and doctrines

that we miss other centres of faith.

FEAST OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA - Saturday 13th May Our Lady of Fatima Shrine, Portugal, is a pilgrimage shrine dating from the 1917 apparitions of the Virgin Mary to three shepherd children. It is significant for its call to conversion, the

consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, the recitation of the rosary, prayers for world peace and the three heavenly secrets were revealed there. Lúcia Santos and her two cousins, Jacinta and Francisco Marto were three shepherd children to whom Our Lady appeared at Fatima in Portugal on the 13th day of six consecutive months starting on 13th May 1917. Lúcia described the vision as *"brighter than the sun"* and

said the lady told them three secrets, asked them to do penance and make sacrifices to save sinners. The children then began to wear tight cords around their waists, abstained from drinking water on hot days and did other works of penance.

The lady told them to say the Rosary every day, and that saying the Rosary was the way to 'personal peace and world peace.' On the third anniversary of her death, 13th February 2008, Pope Benedict XVI announced that in Lúcia's case he was waiving the five year waiting period prescribed by ecclesiastical law before opening a cause for beatification, thus putting her on a fast track for canonisation, as was done for Mother Teresa and Pope John Paul II.
