ABSOLUTE INTIMACY WITH GOD

One of my ongoing prayers - Lord, help me not to miss the obvious, help me to notice, help me to see... I pray for this Grace so I do not get carried away by a misleading concept of insignificant things or insignificant words! The Native American wisdom teaches - be impeccable with your words. Our Scripture teaches that every word and letter matters.

One of the shortest and maybe the most repeated words in our prayer lives and our liturgies, is the Ancient Hebrew word AMEN. Sometimes it's softly whispered, sometimes it's joyfully proclaimed.

This powerful word is used in several ways in our Scriptures and the most common placement of AMEN is at the end of a prayer, sermon, or statement - as an agreement! It translates as 'SO IT IS' or 'MAY IT BE FULFILLED'. I let AMEN confirm the words of prayer when I say it - I believe with all my being that what I prayed for and about or what I just heard at the liturgy, even though I cannot reason it or will never be able to understand it fully. I try to remind myself and allow myself to be reminded that I am eternally held in God's Love even if I may not understand or reason so many things and events... so may it all rest in the Lord as I go about my daily life breathing in and breathing out the faithfulness of God Himself.

One of my Friend's puts it so well, he says - "Isn't it mind blowing that we eat God! I think whether it's bonkers or it's an absolute truth and if it is the truth, then it's the most amazing thing in the world - absolute intimacy with God!"

Pope Francis was admitted to Rome's A. Gemelli University Hospital where he will undergo surgery in the early afternoon.

A statement released by the Holy See Press Office said the Holy Father "will undergo a laparotomy and abdominal wall surgery under general anaesthesia."

The Press Office added that the Pope will remain in the hospital for several days "to allow for a normal post-operative course and full functional recovery."

The Pope's admission to the hospital follows a visit and consultation with doctors at the same facility on Tuesday afternoon.
