JESUS AND "THE TWELVE"

Jesus had something very special that drew people to him. He made a real impact on the simple men and women of Galilee, attracting great crowds wherever he went. Some came out of curiosity, some to be healed, others to be fed. Some welcomed him into their homes, others dined with him.

At a point in time Jesus chooses from the crowd a group of twelve men to form his most intimate circle. We read in today's Gospel that out of compassion for the crowds who were like sheep without a shepherd, tired and dejected, he chose twelve men who would transmit his message and eventually start the movement that gave rise to Christianity.

It was quite an assorted group. The Twelve were simple men of little education who lived by their work. There were no scribes or priests among them. But like any group there were differences.

Peter stood out among the Twelve as their leader and spokesman. With his brother, Andrew, he was a fisherman. He was married and lived with his in-laws. Peter was committed to Jesus, spontaneous and enthusiastic and at the same time capable of doubt, helpless in a crisis and fearful. He solemnly declared Jesus as Messiah, Son of God and later denied he ever knew him.

Brothers James and John were fishermen. Their father Zebedee owned a boat and employed workers. Their ambitious mother wanted the best seats in God's kingdom for her two sons. Jesus called them "Sons of Thunder". They were impetuous and probably caused tension in the group.

Simon, the Zealot, a revolutionary who opposed Roman domination had to accept Matthew the tax collector as one of the Twelve. Thomas believed in seeing things for himself. Andrew and Philip spoke Greek and welcomed believers who wanted to see Jesus. Bartholomew/Nathanael, questioned if anything good came from Nazareth. Judas controlled the common purse and knew the price of everything. He betrayed Jesus for thirty pieces of silver.

A Father's Day Prayer


God,
