Tríníty Sunday

Recently I was teaching my granddaughter to make the sign of the cross and I had to explain the concept of the Holy Trinity. I told her that God created the world, He spoke through his prophets of how he wanted people to live-but no one listened to them. He decided then that he would send his only son Jesus, 'God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son'. Jesus was conceived by the Holy Spirit to a young Jewish girl called Mary. Jesus's mission was not to condemn the world, but so that through him the world might be saved.

Jesus was born in a stable at Bethlehem to Mary his mother and her husband Joseph. Jesus lived at home in Nazareth with Mary and Joseph until he was thirty years of age and then he set out around Galilee, Judea, Samaria and surrounding areas healing people and performing miracles. He was betrayed by Judas, the Romans hung him on a cross and crucified him, after three days he rose from the dead and appeared to his apostles over 40 days before He ascended back to His Father in Heaven. This Feast is called the Ascension, but before he left them, he told them that he would send His Holy Spirit to guide and help them for the rest of time, which is called Pentecost. It is the Greek word meaning 50 days. This Feast is followed by the Feast of the Blessed Trinity, which is what we celebrate today.

There are three persons in the One God: The Father and the Son, Jesus and the Holy Spirit. The Father loves His Son Jesus, and the Holy Spirit is that bond of love between the father and the Son.

Our celebration of the Trinity invites us to take time to contemplate what God is like and what that means for us. We claim that God is a Trinity of being: three

persons who are one God, a uniquely Christian belief that sounds like blasphemy to some world religions and nonsense to others. St. Patrick and the shamrock aside, the only way to approach this idea is to contemplate it as a mystery. That means to mull it over with an attitude that revels in awe and lets go of the need for clear answers. God's Trinitarian being is a mystery in the deepest sense of the word, a reality that fascinates us, draws us toward God, and is too deep for our thought and prayer to exhaust.

If you have to explain it to a child, teach her/him the Sign of the Cross and say that it means that God loves us in more ways than we can count.

> St Columba (Colmcille) of Iona 521-597 Feast Day 9th June

St Colmcille (or Columba) is one of the three patron saints of Ireland along with St Patrick and St Brigid. He initiated the movement known as the 'peregrinatio pro Christo' emigration in adventure for Christ - monks from Ireland going into voluntary exile and so becoming missionaries in Britain and Europe. Colmcille was born at Gartan, Co Donegal and belonged to the Cenél Conaill, a branch of the



Uí Néill dynasty. His father was Feidhlimidh and his great grandfather was Niall Naoi nGiallach who brought St Patrick as a slave to Ireland and gave his name to the Uí Néill. His mother was Eithne, a princess from Leinster where Christianity was well established . Fostered first to a holy man called Cruithnechan near Kilmacrennan, he then went to Leinster to a Christian bard called Gemman, which accounts for his later closeness to the *filidh*.

Colmcille then went for monastic formation to St Finian's monastery at Movilla on Strangford Lough, Co Down, where he studied theology and learned the art of copying and illuminating manuscripts. Here he became a deacon and later went on to complete his education with St Mobhi at Glasnevin, Enda of Aran and Finian of Clonard. Ordained a priest around 546, Colmcille's first monastic foundation was close to his home territory in Derry. His other major foundation in Ireland was at Durrow, Co Laois (both have the name *doire*, meaning "oak tree"). For the next seventeen years he continued teaching and preaching in Ireland.

In 563 Colmcille left Ireland and eventually settled on the island of Iona off the south-west corner of Mull, off Scotland. Colmcille remained in Scotland for most of his remaining thirty-four years. At the monastic settlement in Iona, he built up a large community devoted to prayer, study and physical work. It also became a place of learning with the copying and illumination of manuscripts that produced the Cathach of Colmcille (a 6th century copy of the psalms 30-150) and others like the Book of Kells.

SHANNONSIDE

Flowing through the University of Limerick, the Shannon River empowers all around it. Who knows its influence on Chuck Feeney when he gifted around 500 million Euro in current value to U.L. to fund the World Academy of Music

and Dance and several other projects in the University. There are several small islands in the river which formed when the flow level was reduced in the 1920s to accommodate the hydro-electric scheme at Ardnacrusha. A winding footbridge links both parts of the college and embraces you as you cross it. The Medicine and Health Sciences Buildings are beside the Academy of

Music and Dance and nurture each other. Down beside the river is a wooded area, just magical. How inspirational this must be for all the faculties nestled around it. The Irish Chamber Orchestra is based here. Off you go on the train and then take the local bus out to the University. Mesmerising,


