Pearl of Great Price

If you were approached by God, as was Solomon, and told, "Ask something of me and I will give it to you," how would you respond? Would you ask for money, a happy family, good health. or world peace? Solomon asked for "an understanding heart to judge your people and to distinguish right from wrong." Without minimizing the selfless character of his request, we may remember that, as king, he had no need for more riches. However, he certainly could have sought revenge on his enemies. Instead, he asked for the disposition needed to serve his people well. How would you respond? It takes insight to realize what we should treasure and what is not worthy of us. This is particularly difficult when society assaults us with negative values. Perhaps we should all pray for "an understanding heart."

provide glimpses into the reign of heaven. The first two lend themselves to this reflection. They maintain that it is the reign of heaven that really counts. This reign is characterized as a treasure in a field or a pearl of great price. The parables challenge us to be willing to sell everything we have that this treasure may be ours. What is this reign of heaven, for which we should be willing to give up all else? It is a way of living life here and now, not merely a state of being that will unfold after death. It is a life of faithful commitment; it is a life of integrity, of trust in God and service of others. Paul describes this as a life of conformity to the image of God's own Son. All are given the opportunity to discover the treasure. All will have to sell what they must to acquire it. The cost may be great, but "all things work for good for those who love God."

The pearl is there for everyone. All that we need to sell or to detach from is our own self-will. Only God can give us the strength to let go what we are holding on to that separates us from Him who is the pearl. Our tragedy is not

that we cannot find the pearl but that we may be unwilling to pay the price.

Judgment is for later. Right now, it is for us to use the time given to us to go in search of the treasure and the pearl of great price, of the gift to be able to identify, with Jesus, the true, the good and the beautiful, and to help others too in the search.

Jesus is the Way the Truth and the life. Hence, he is the pearl and the way to the pearl.


Nursing a Java black coffee in Newlands', the Pansies are assailing us on the double, the scent and the kaleidoscope of colour. What great joy.
