'WHO DO YOU SAY I AM?'

Peter replied, 'You are the Christ,' he said, 'the Son of the living God.' Jesus replied, 'Simon, son of Jonah, you are a happy man! Because it was not flesh and blood that revealed this to you but my Father in heaven.'

Who is Jesus Christ for you?

Oftentimes, when I've found that, when I have tried to answer this question as honestly as I possibly can, I have found that God has honoured that honesty and showed up in a real way for me.

A child praying said, "God, take care of my mother, take care of my father and take care of yourself. Because if anything happens to you, we're all in big trouble." It has nothing to do with how much we have, or how hard we work or strive to achieve but how much He has blessed and given us.

He owns the cattle on a thousand hills and the hills they're on. How blessed our life is, is a reflection of how he has blessed us. If He's risen and seated in the heavens, then so too are we. He is successful and victorious, and as we are in Him, so too are we. Learn the wisdom of this child's prayer. <u>If He's doing well, we'll be doing</u> <u>well if we dwell in Him.</u> If anything would happen to Him, we would all be in trouble. But it's not going to. So, rejoice, because He has blessed us.

Know your Faith – Come to Pathways: Exploring Faith and Ministry

Applications are now open for the next intake of participants for *Pathways*. The programme, run by the Dublin Archdiocese, begins this year in DCU St Patrick's Campus, Upper Drumcondra Road, Dublin 9, on Thursday, September 28 (7pm – 9.30pm). Places are limited so early application is advised. *Pathways* is a two-year, one-evening-a-week course for adults of all ages who wish to explore their faith. It runs

from late September to May each year. There are no exams and no written work. The only requirement is an openness to listening to others and to participate. You can just come along and enjoy! The cost is €400 for the coming year which may be paid in instalments. Some sponsorship may be available for those of limited means. *Places are limited*.

The Season of Creation has a special significance for the Catholic Church, particularly since Pope Francis established 1 September as an

annual World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation. The Season of Creation is marked throughout the Christian world from 1 September to 4 October (Feast of Saint Francis of Assisi) and celebrates the joy of creation as well as encouraging awareness-raising initiatives to protect the natural environment.

This year's theme is "Let Justice and Peace Flow" taking inspiration from the Prophet Amos who declares: "Let justice roll on like a river, righteousness like a never-failing stream!" (Amos 5: 24). And so we are called to join the river of justice and peace, to take up climate and ecological justice, and to speak out with and for communities most impacted by climate injustice and the loss of biodiversity.

As the people of God, we must work together on behalf of all Creation, as part of that mighty river of peace and justice.
