Synod 2023

The 16th General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops, called by Pope Francis, opens in Rome on Wednesday 4th October, the feast of St. Francis of Assisi. The focus of the discussions is on synodality, how we work together as a Christian community listening to God's word and to one another, and discerning with the help of the Holy Spirit the way forward for our Church at this moment in time.

Following consultation with Catholic people throughout the world at parish, diocesan, national and continental levels, key characteristics of what constitutes a synodal Church have emerged.

These are summarised in the *Instrumentum Laboris*, the working document that will guide the Synod discussions as follows:

A synodal Church is founded on the recognition of a common dignity deriving from Baptism

A synodal Church is a Church that listens and a Church of listening
A synodal Church is a Church that desires to be humble, and knows it has much
to learn

A synodal Church is a Church of encounter and dialogue, which is not afraid of the variety it bears, but values it without forcing it into uniformity A synodal Church is a Church that is open, welcoming and embraces all A synodal Church is a Church willing and able to handle tensions without being crushed by them

A synodal Church is a restless Church because she is aware that she is vulnerable and incomplete

A synodal Church is also a Church of discernment

Three key words will direct the work of the Synod over the coming weeks. These words are *Communion*, *Mission* and *Participation*. The Synod will look at the question of how to grow in *communion* by welcoming all, no one excluded, in fidelity to the Gospel; the question of concrete ways for co-responsibility, recognising and valuing the contribution of each baptised person in view of the common *mission*; the identification of structures and dynamics of governance through which to articulate *participation* and authority over time in a missionary synodal Church.

Let us pray for an outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the work of the Synod over the coming weeks, that it may bear much fruit so that our Church may be a more faithful and authentic witness to Jesus Christ as we continue the mission entrusted to us of bringing the Good News of salvation to the ends of the earth.

MONDAY 2nd OCTOBER Feast of the Holy Guardian Angels

Angels are mentioned in more than half of the books of the Bible and three angels are named archangels or highest angels in different writings - Michael, (Dan 10:13, Jude 9 and Rev 12:7), *Gabriel* (Dan 8:16 and Luke 1:19 and 26) and Raphael in the Book of Tobit). The Greekword angellos means "messenger" and in the Bible angels act as messengers of God. For example, an angel appears to Zechariah in the temple foretelling the birth of John the Baptist (Lk 1:11-20), to Joseph and Mary foretelling the birth of Jesus (Mt1:20-25 and Lk 1:26-38) and to the women at Jesus' tomb telling of his resurrection (Mt 28:2-7; Jn 20:11-13). The belief in guardian angels is based on the protecting power of God as expressed in Psalm 90:10-12: Upon you no evil shall fall, no plaque approach where you dwell. for you has he commanded his angels, to keep you in all your ways. They shall bear you upon their hands lest you strike your foot against a stone.... and on what Jesus says about little children (Mt 18:10) 'See that you never despise any of these little ones, for I tell you that their angels in heaven are continually in the presence of my father in heaven.' The third century Christian theologian Origen wrote: For each of us in the church of God, no matter how small, there is a good angel of the Lord who stands before the face of God to rule and move and govern, to correct our actions and intercede for us in our sufferings.

UN International Day of Older Persons

1st October 2023

On 14 December 1990, the United Nations General Assembly designated October 1 as the International Day of Older Persons. This was preceded by initiatives such as the Vienna International Plan of Action on Ageing, which was adopted by the 1982 World Assembly on Ageing and endorsed later that year by the UN General Assembly. In 1991, the General Assembly adopted the United Nations Principles for Older Persons. In 2002, the Second World Assembly on Ageing adopted the Madrid International Plan of Action on Ageing, to respond to the opportunities and challenges of population ageing in the 21st century and to promote the development of a society for all ages The number of older people (defined as those aged 65 years or older) tripled from around 260 million in 1980 to 761 million in 2021. Between 2021 and 2050, the global share of the older population is projected to increase from less than 10% to around 17%. Rapid growth in the number of people reaching older ages underscores the significance of promoting health, preventing, and treating illnesses throughout the entire course of life. In societies with aging populations, it becomes imperative to adjust to the increasing number of elderly individuals who possess a diverse range of functional capacities. The capability to carry out essential functions and partake in everyday activities is influenced not solely by an individual's inherent capacity but also by the social and physical environments in which they reside. Supportive environments play a pivotal role in assisting older individuals to maintain their activity levels and independence as they progress in age.
