



JESUS AND THE PHARISEES

To- day's Gospel may take us by surprise. Jesus is very scathing of the religious leaders of his time. He warned his disciples against them. The scribes and Pharisees were past masters at telling people what should be done, without doing it themselves. They were anxious to be looked up to and highly esteemed, but they sought only to dominate others, not to serve them, insisting that people give them titles and show them deference.

But Jesus on the other hand was careful to point out to the people and to his disciples that in spite of all their shortcomings the scribes and Pharisees were the official leaders, "occupying the chair of Moses" and as official leaders they should do as they say and observe what they preach but they should not imitate their conduct because they did not practise what they preached.

Effective leadership for Jesus is to lead by example, to walk the talk. During his life Jesus led by example and invited others to imitate him:

"Learn from me for I am meek and humble of heart".

"I came to serve and not to be served".

Followers of Jesus in every walk of life are called to serve, to love one another, to be helpful and caring and not to burden others unnecessarily. Jesus who said "My yolk is easy and by burden is light" never intended his teaching to be a burden. He invited people who were burdened to come to him and he would give them rest. Matthew, who wrote this Gospel after the Jewish-Roman War in 70AD when Jerusalem and the Temple were destroyed and tensions arose between Rabbinic Judaism and the newly formed Gentile Christian community,

clearly has a bee in his bonnet about the scribes and Pharisees. The entire twenty third chapter of his gospel is devoted to condemning their tendency to exaggerate outward observance of the law and neglect the inner meaning. Biblical scholars tell us that the vehemence of this chapter is due more to Matthew's editing than to any hostility on the part of Jesus towards the Pharisees.

Jesus was compassionate to the sinner and gentle with those who had gone astray. He patiently instructed the Pharisee, Nicodemus, who came to him by night, and he willingly accepted dinner invitations from Pharisees, but he was openly angry with those who used religious leadership for their own advantage.

To serve God humbly is the greatest of all callings.

Pope's November prayer intention: For the Pope

In "The Pope Video" for November, Pope Francis asks the faithful to "Pray to the Lord that He will bless me," saying, "Your prayer gives me strength and helps me to discern and to



accompany the Church, listening to the Holy Spirit. Each month the Pope offers a specific prayer intention, inviting men and women of good will to pray with him for a particular cause. Recent intentions have included prayers for the Synod, for people living on the margins, and for World Youth Day.

Pope Francis reminds the faithful in this month's video that "The fact that someone is Pope doesn't mean they lose their humanity. On the contrary, my humanity grows each day with God's holy and faithful people." He adds, "Being Pope is also a process. The person becomes aware of what it means to be a pastor. And in this process, he learns how to be more charitable, more merciful, and, above all, more patient, like God our Father, who is so patient."

Knowing that popes are often "judged harshly" and will have to render "a serious account" of their ministry to God, Pope Francis asks his listeners "to judge benevolently" and "pray that the Pope, whoever he might be – today it is my turn – may receive the help of the Holy Spirit, that he may be docile to that help." Specifically, he asks for prayers for the Pope "so that in the exercise of his mission, he may continue to accompany in the faith the flock entrusted to him by Jesus, always with the help of the Holy Spirit." And, hearkening back to the night of his election ten years ago, Pope Francis repeats his request for a "silent" prayer over him, concluding "And pray for me! Fayorably!"

ALL SAINTS OF IRELAND Feast Day 6th November

Pope Benedict XV beatified Oliver Plunkett in 1920 and during his papacy also (1914-22) the Feast of All the Saints of Ireland was instituted.

Oliver Plunkett was canonised in 1975, thus becoming the first new Irish saint for almost seven hundred years. It recalls especially the seventeen Irish Martyrs of the 16th and 17th centuries who were beatified by Pope John Paul II in 1992 and many others who died as a result of persecution during what in Ireland are known as the "Penal Times".

Only four Irish saints: Ss Malachy (1094-1148), Laurence O'Toole (1128-80) Oliver Plunkett (1625-81) and St Charles of Mount Argus (1821-93), have been officially canonised. All the other Irish saints, such as Ss Patrick, Brigid, and Colmcille, are saints, as it were, by acclamation of the local Church, before the official Papal canonisation process was established.

Let us praise illustrious men and women, our ancestors in their successive generations. The Lord has created an abundance of glory, and displayed his greatness from earliest times.
