#### GAUDETE SUNDAY

Isaiah 61:1-2.10-11 reading begins with a promise of salvation and ends with a prayer of thanksgiving for the salvation granted. It contains several prophetic themes: - God cares for the afflicted; - God saves through the agency of human beings; - God fulfils promises; - all things are accomplished through God's grace.

In 1 Thess 5:16-24 Paul concludes this letter to the Thessalonians with exhortation, encouragement, and blessing. His admonitions are crisp and concrete: rejoice, pray, give thanks, and asks the community to be unceasing in these three practices. In John the Evangelist's Gospel he is preparing for one who is already amid the people, John the Baptist, but unrecognised. This unrecognised individual will far exceed anything that John Baptist might do because he far exceeds anything the Baptist might be, he is content to be the first witness, herald, and nothing more.

Today is Gaudete Sunday - Gaudete is the Latin word for Joy. We light the third candle which is a pink one to mark a turning point in our preparation for the arrival of Jesus on Christmas Day. We are called in the first reading to be the arms and mouth of Jesus in today's world. He sent us, that is you and me, to bring the Gospel to people who don't yet know Jesus; to set prisoners free; to set the downtrodden free; to make the blind see; and the deaf hear. God saves through the agency of human beings; - God fulfils promises; - all things are accomplished through God's grace. That is God's promise to us.

In the second reading Paul encourages us to rejoice, pray, give thanks, and asks the community to be unceasing in these three practices. Incidentally, all miracles are preceded by giving thanks and praise to God. Isaiah is calling us to work miracles in God's name and Paul is telling us how.

In John's Gospel, John the Evangelist is telling us that John the Baptist is the first herald of Jesus coming among us and he is not fit to tie his sandals. A statement of truth and humility, also needed in working miracles is to acknowledge that we are not the healers - we are merely the instruments that Jesus may choose to use in His mission.

This is surely good joyful news - that you and I are called to mission, He is not looking at our ability or inability only our availability. He is looking for us to say yes to His invitation, He will work through us by giving us all the graces and power to achieve His purposes. To prepare us for this work He has invited each of us to the Sacrament of Reconciliation, because grace flows easier through a clean vessel, and He invites us as his disciples not to keep this good news to ourselves but to invite our families, friends, neighbours, and work colleagues to come back to the sacraments this Christmas.
