

Living life purposefully

In Mark's Gospel, the beginning of the public ministry of Jesus is presented as one of great healings. Jesus cures people who are sick and possessed by devils. In this Sunday's reading we see the whole town crowding round the door of the house Jesus was staying in eager to be cured of their ailments and afflictions. Jesus heals many of them. It must have been an amazing sight and quite some evening in that town.

After the inevitable clamour and chaos of the evening before, Jesus rises early the following morning and heads off to a lonely place to pray. He needs some quiet time to himself, to pray, to recollect and to prepare for what lay ahead. Jesus is full of determination. There is a purpose to his life. When the disciples catch up with him, they set off on their mission with Jesus preaching in the towns and villages of Galilee and continuing to bring healing to the people.

What I like about this Gospel passage is the image of Jesus beginning his day with prayer. Jesus takes some quiet time to focus and prepare for the day. It's something that we could usefully try to imitate in our own lives. Our days can so often be busy and filled with activities that we have little time to think or reflect. Spending a few minutes at the beginning of the day with the Lord, asking him to help us, guide us and be with us throughout the day can make such a difference. It reminds us that in faithfully going about our daily duties we are tasked with the responsibility of proclaiming the message of Jesus and, through our words and actions, making his love visible to all those we encounter during the day.

ST BRIGID'S RELIC, KILDARE

We're on the train to Kildare buzzing to visit the Relic of St. Brigid in St. Brigid's Church, in Kildare town. A steady flow of pilgrims are there and what a lovely atmosphere of inclusivity is enveloping us. A knowledgeable pilgrim gives us the story of the relic, preserved in Lumiar, a district in Lisbon city, where veneration is still alive. A lovely garden graces the altar surround.
