4th Sunday of Lent

"God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not be lost but may have eternal life." This verse is the very heart of the Gospel! These words are the Gospel in a nutshell. If by some tragedy, all the pages of all the Bibles in the world were destroyed, and this one verse alone survived, it would be more than enough to summarise the entire history of salvation. All that is recorded in the Old Testament is but a preparation for the coming of Jesus as our Saviour; all that follows in the New Testament is but a completion of that saving plan.

It speaks first of God's love; it then deals with eternal life and finally, it ends with judgment. "God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son." God loved the world. He created the universe to share His goodness. Even more, God loves each one of us and excludes no one. St. Augustine says: "God loves each of us as though we are the only one to be loved." He pours his infinite love into our littleness; his infinite power into our weakness; his infinite wisdom into our foolishness; his infinite holiness into our sinfulness. Saint or sinner, good or evil, right, or wrong, God loves us. No matter what we do; no matter what we become, no matter how far we may stray from him, God loves each one of us as he lovingly awaits our return. His love is a gift: we cannot demand it; we do not deserve it; we can only gratefully receive it. "It is when we deserve love least that God loves us most!" The turning point in our spiritual life will come about not when we know how much we love God, but when we experience how much He loves us.

Together with God's love and the joy of eternal life that comes when we accept that love, today's gospel also teaches us about judgement. When we refuse God's love, when we reject his grace, when we prefer darkness to light, when we choose evil rather than good, we are passing sentence on ourselves. It is not God who is judging or condemning us; it is rather we who are judging and condemning ourselves. We resemble the person who shuts the windows and draws the curtains preferring to remain in darkness when the sun is shining brightly outside. Or as St. Augustine puts it: "The patient who refuses the prescription of his doctor harms and destroys himself." Come and receive God's healing in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Invite your family and friends to come back to the sacraments and this is the greatest act of love you can do for anyone. None of us know the day nor the hour when we are called out of this life to meet our final judgement, we don't need to know, but we do need to be ready.

That is what Lent is about; preparing us to encounter Jesus' love in a new way.


