## You are witnesses

We continue with the post-resurrection stories in the Scripture readings at Mass this Sunday. Jesus appears again to his disciples in the Gospel and greets them with his familiar words, "Peace be with you". The disciples are far from being at peace and are in fact quite agitated. They are having great difficulty grasping the reality of the resurrection of Jesus. None the less, Jesus is very patient with them. He opens their minds to understand the scriptures and helps them to see all that he had foretold would take place. Jesus reminds them that they are witnesses to all that has happened and are now tasked with preaching the Good News of salvation to all the nations.

In the first reading, we see the disciples engaged in this task of preaching the Good News. Peter is preaching to the people of Jerusalem. Like Jesus with the disciples, Peter is now helping the people grasp the context in which the recent events of the death and resurrection of Jesus are to be understood. Peter echoes the words of Jesus and finishes by calling the people to repentance.

The common theme in both readings is that the disciples of Jesus are called to be witnesses to the resurrection of Jesus. That's as true for us today as it was for the first disciples all those years ago in Jerusalem. Like the first disciples, we must patiently present the Good News to the people of our own time and place. In so doing we can help people to understand the sacred Scriptures in the context of today's world and invite them into a new and ever deeper relationship with Jesus. Our faith is centred on having a personal relationship with Jesus. It is based on realising that we are infinitely loved by God despite the many faults and failings of our human lives.

As we rejoice in these Easter times, we are invited to reflect on our own personal relationship with Jesus. I suggest three questions that might be worth taking some time to think about. How do I nurture and sustain my faith in Jesus? Do I read my Bible and allow Jesus to open my mind to understand the Scriptures? How do I fulfil my baptismal calling and witness to Jesus in living my everyday life?

May you know the peace of Christ in your heart and life this Easter season.

#### All Ireland Rosary Rally: Knock - June 1st

The All Ireland Rosary Rally is back this year on Saturday, June 1st in Knock. The day begins with a Marian Conference at 9.30 am in St John's Centre. Speakers include: Fr Michael Donnelly, Sr Ana Margarita Lanzas SCTJM, and Fr Joseph Maria Deane CFR.

Then there will be an opportunity to meet over 20 apostolates from around Ireland from 1130 am in St John's Centre. A well-renowned speaker from Miami called Mother Adela Galindo will deliver the keynote Rosary talk at 1 pm in the Basilica. Then there will be the Stations of the Cross outside at 2 pm, followed by the Rosary Procession. Bishop Phonsie Cullinan will be the Main Celebrant of the 3 pm Concelebrated Mass which will include Anointing of the Sick. Confessions are available throughout the day, and there will be rosary and scapular-making workshops in the marquee.

#### FEAST DAYS THIS WEEK

Thursday 18th April St. Laserian of Leighlin, Bishop

#### ST. LASERIAN (d. 639) - Feast Day 18th April

Laserian was the son of Cairel de Blitha and Gemma, a

Scottish princess and may have spent his early years in Scotland. He was also said to have been a disciple of St Munnu. He is said then to have spent fourteen years in Rome and studied under St Gregory the Great, who ordained him and sent him back to Ireland (?). At any rate he was a strong proponent of the Roman method of calculating Easter. When he came back to Ireland, he took over an already established monastery from St Gobban at Leighlin (Leth-glen, half-glen, a fold in the hills), Co Carlow. Leighlin then became a strong centre of support of the Roman method of calculation. However, his former teacher Munnu at the Council of Maigh Ailbe on the borders of Kildare and Carlow challenged Laserian to a contest of miracles. He suggested they would throw the books containing the old and new calculations of Easter in the fire to see which burned. Laserian declined this as unfair, saying: "If you, Finta, told Slieve Margy over there to move to Magh Ailbe, and Magh Ailbe over to where Slieve Margy is, God would do it for you." It took some decades for the Roman way of computing Easter was finally accepted and approved at the Synod of Whitby (664). Another story about Laserian is told in the Life of Maighnean of Kilmainham. Maighnean found Laserian lying crossways in a hovel suffering from thirty diseases. "My sinfulness goes like a flame through my body, for I want to have my purgatory in this life and find eternal life in the next. For the grain of wheat must be threshed and beaten before it is sown in the earth. So it is with me before I am laid in the grave. I want my body threshed with infirmities." In the end Laserian asked Maighnean to preside at his funeral. Laserian is the patron saint of Leighlin diocese. The present Cathedral in Old Leighlin was begun by Bishop Donatus of Leighlin (1152-81) and completed by the end of the 13th century. One of the oldest items in the Cathedral is an 11th century font. The cathedral was taken over by the Anglican Communion (Church of Ireland) at the time of the Reformation. A new Roman Catholic Cathedral (Cathedral of the Assumption) designed by Thomas Cobden was completed in Carlow town in 1833.


