Lay Ministry Sunday

The concept of ministry that exists in many Irish parishes today is typically a very narrow one. It is identified almost exclusively with those who are ordained to the priesthood and those living in consecrated religious life. Even as ministries have opened up to lay people, they are almost always viewed as ministries exercised solely during Mass or liturgies. So we have Ministers of the Word and Ministers of the Eucharist for example which we are all familiar with.

Ministry is often seen as something done by a small group of people for the many in the parish community, and usually in the context of liturgical celebration. This is totally at odds with what a proper understanding of what ministry in the church actually should be. The call to ministry is proper to every member of the Christian community. It derives from the sacrament of baptism which every member of the Christian community has received. Every Christian is called to service of the community and every Christian has something to offer to the community. How each person ministers in the parish community will likely change and vary over time and is very much dependent on each person's individual gifts, talents and skill sets.

In Clondalkin parish we are blessed with many people giving of their time and energies and enriching the lives of the communities in the Village, Knockmitten and Clonburris. However, Clondalkin parish will only be a vibrant Christian community in future years if a sufficient number of parishioners engage in voluntary lay ministry working in partnership with whatever priests, deacons and pastoral workers the Archbishop may assign to the parish from time to time. It is lay people having an understanding of their baptismal calling to ministry, and who willingly take ownership and responsibility for various parish activities, who will ensure that the Christian faith which has been an abiding presence in the Clondalkin area for so many centuries will continue to thrive today and in the years ahead.

This Lay Ministry Sunday is an opportunity to acknowledge the good work done voluntarily by people in our parish. It is also a moment that invites us to reflect on how much more could be done and to raise awareness of the many needs of the parish that require new volunteers. The Parish Pastoral Council is currently discussing how our parish can foster the spirit of volunteerism and seeking to identify what particular aspects of parish life are in need of new volunteers at this time. Perhaps there will be something for you to consider getting involved in.


