In today's Gospel, Jesus reaches Jerusalem for the very last time. The events, which happened back then are also happening now as they did for over two millennia. You may have heard this Gospel for the first time. Maybe you heard something in it for the first time, even though you listened to it or read it all your life. In every case, what you notice in it, what you hear, what strikes you is unique to you at this given moment. I trust that it is a truly intimate way of the Spirit moving in us and that we are drawn to trust this invitation to go deeper. So let us go deeper. It's up to you to choose the time and place and when you do, sit somewhere at home, light a candle or maybe in nature, read the Gospel slowly a few times and pray with Jesus every step of the way.

Some guiding steps for your prayer from the Tarsus Scripure School – tarsus.ie - Hearers of the Word.

"When you read the passage, stay with whatever part of it resonates with your own life, but make sure, when you pray it that you stay with the passage until you get beyond the violence and the horror to find a good news lesson for you.

- In this scene of great tragedy, there are people helping others, either reluctantly or with compassion: Simon, the women of Jerusalem, the criminal on the cross, and Jesus himself. Note the differences in the way the help is given (as a burden, with sympathy, etc). What has been your experience of helping and being helped?
- Despite the persecution by the leaders Jesus still shows forgiveness. When have you seen that spirit of forgiveness in yourself or in others? In your experience what is the effect of a forgiving spirit ... or the absence of that spirit?
- ·Towards the end there is a ray of light. Jesus says "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit." His relationship with his Father was one of trust, even at a moment like this. What difference has it made to you in times of difficulty or pain to have a relationship of trust with God, or with someone else?"
- · When you come to the natural end prayer, take a few moments to thank God for this time, ask for the Grace you need, then lovingly whisper or say aloud the following words:

INTO YOUR HANDS, LORD, I COMMEND MY SPIRIT.
YOU HAVE REDEEMED US, LORD GOD OF TRUTH.
INTO YOUR HANDS, LORD, I COMMEND MY SPIRIT.
GLORY BE TO THE FATHER, AND TO THE SON, AND TO THE HOLY SPIRIT,
INTO YOUR HANDS, LORD, I COMMEND MY SPIRIT. Amen.

Can you teach it? No. In belief, you just internally launch into it. Maybe pulling the veil back for only a few seconds but, boy, the rewards are awesome.


All Creation is suspended in this Eternal Light and thereby all are equally appreciated.
