#### THREE EASTER SEEKERS

All four gospels tell of women coming to the tomb of Jesus early in the morning after the Jewish Sabbath wanting to honour the body of Jesus by anointing. Women not only give life they also protect it.

John's Gospel puts the spotlight on one woman, Mary Magdalene. She came early on the first day of the week while it was still dark. The darkness of the early morning reflected the darkness of her grieving. She had stood by the cross and witnessed his hasty burial. She wanted to care for the body of her beloved friend.

What she saw when she reached the tomb shattered her. The stone at the entrance had been rolled away. The tomb was empty. Her natural reaction was that Jesus' body had been stolen. She ran to tell Peter and John: "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb and we do not know where they have put him"

Her running to two of Jesus' friends was totally understandable. When we are given unexpected news our first thought is to share it with people we trust. Mary ran from the tomb. Peter and John ran to the tomb. Running can be a sign of great emotion. Mary ran out of fear, confusion and distress. Peter and John ran hoping it was all a big mistake on Mary's part. They did not understand Jesus when he said he would rise from the dead.

When they reached the tomb one searcher saw an empty tomb and the "linen wrappings lying there". The other saw that Jesus had passed through death into new life and believed.

In this Resurrection scene there are three forms of searching: LOVE searching for presence, INTIMACY searching for meaning and FAILURE searching for forgiveness. Each searcher was needed. Without Mary, Peter and John would not have discovered the empty tomb. Without John, the Beloved disciple, the meaning of the empty tomb would not be understood. Without Peter who earlier denied Jesus, forgiveness would have no meaning.

Mary returns to the place of death and meets the Risen Jesus, who called her by her name and sent her to spread the Good News of Easter:

"The Lord is risen, Alleluia! He is truly risen, Alleluia!"
