5th Sunday of Lent

"Neither do I condemn you. Go now and sin no more."

We need to hear these words of Jesus more often! No matter what the world says or thinks about us, no matter how negative and judgemental we are towards ourselves, Jesus understands us because he knows our human frailty and fickleness. What immense relief the woman must have felt when she heard these words!

There is much that we can learn from this encounter, which is recounted only in the Gospel according to John (8:1-11). It was daybreak; A new day had dawned. The dawn is always a sign of light, of a fresh beginning. No matter how dark the night of our sin may have been, the dawn of God's merciful love and amazing grace has the power to dispel that darkness. We need never stay in darkness. The break of day challenges us to break away from the darkness to light.

The scribes and Pharisees citing the law wanted her to be stoned. *"What have you to say?*" they ask Jesus as a test. They were determined to condemn the woman. They had decided to bring an accusation against Jesus himself should he say something different from what Moses had ordered in the Law. Jesus does not answer their question. Rather, he bends down and starts to write on the ground with his finger. Some say that he was writing the sins they had committed. But when they persist, he straightens up and confronting them says: *"Let the one among you who is guiltless be the first to throw a stone."* (John 8:7).

Jesus does not condemn. Neither does He condone the evil committed. Rather, He shows compassion for the woman and each one of us too in our own situations. He offers her the challenge of conversion, the grace to repent and return. He sees not so much what she was and what she has done, but rather her woundedness and what she can become, if she opens her heart to conversion and change. He helps her understand that the evil into which she had fallen does not express the totality of her person; that there are treasures of goodness in her that have not yet been discovered; that she can turn the page and begin to write a fresh chapter of her life.

There is joy in repentance; the joy of retracing our steps to God; the joy of celebrating his love; the joy we celebrate in sacramental confession.

"Neither do I condemn you." We need to hear these words. They bring us comfort and consolation, happiness and hope for they come from a God who never condemns us and never stops loving us!

The challenge to each of us during Lent is to discover the hidden treasures within ourselves. Prayer, fasting and almsgiving are the means that bring us on this inward journey of discovery and repentance. In Jesus' words: "Neither do I condemn you. Go now and sin no more."

POPE'S APRIL PRAYER INTENTION:



Technology should benefit everyone

In the month of April, Pope Francis dedicates his prayer intention to new technologies and the hope that their use "will not replace human relationships, will respect the dignity of the person, and will help us face the crises of our times." In a world flooded with social media trends and the ever-growing field of artificial intelligence, Pope Francis stresses that "technology is the fruit of the intelligence God gave us." However, he warns against misusing it – as that can have negative consequences. For example, the Pope alludes to problems of isolation and the absence of true relationships. He says, "something's wrong if we spend more time on our cell phones than with people." Pope Francis cautions that the growing use of screens in any form "makes us forget that there are real people behind it who breathe, laugh, and cry." As a result, cyberbullying and hatred begin to fester on social media networks. Technology is not meant to separate man from reality and relationships. Therefore, Pope Francis invites everyone to "look less at screens" and "look each other in the eyes more." Balancing technology with relationships will enable each and every one of us to "discover what really matters: that we are brothers, sisters, children of the same Father."
